From the President's Desk:

There are times when I just want the companionship of other quilters. It doesn't matter if we are working on the same thing or if we each have a different project. Just being with someone who shares my interest can be enough. There are other times when I want to talk with someone else about a guilt I am making. Do you ever wish someone was available to give you advice or you just had someone you could bounce your ideas off? Do you wonder what someone else thinks about what you have already done? Do you need encouragement or are you in a rut? Maybe you aren't sure the colors work together. How should you quilt it? Do you need to add something else? (Buttons? Yoyos? Ribbon? Anything? Nothing?) Should it have another border? If so, how large should it be? What color? Pieced or appliqued?

There are so many decisions to be made when we make a quilt. Some of those decisions we will want to make by ourselves. Other times we may wish for input from other quilters even though we will make the final decisions. My husband will smile and tell me that what I am working on looks "good" but that is not helpful when I am trying to make decisions concerning what I need to do to improve my project.

To meet the needs of the members of our guild, I encourage each of you to consider forming or joining a small group of like-minded quilters. You may be interested in only traditional quilts. You may want to applique, embroider, or do some other technique. You may just want to get together and sew. You may have to meet at a specific time – AM, PM, weekends. Regardless of the needs or interests you have, there may be others in our guild who would like the same things.

In order to find others who share your interests, at our guild meeting you can put a sign-up sheet on the Member's Table to see who is interested. You can make an announcement at the meeting or place a note in the newsletter. Or, you can just talk with your friends to find out if they are interested in forming a group. I believe you will find being a member of a group to be a rewarding experience.

Sew What's for Dinner?



Chicken Mozarella with Sun-Dried Tomatoes

Ingredients:

3 large garlic cloves, minced

1 small jar (3-4 oz) sun-dried tomatoes in oil, or use

1 lb chicken breast tenders

Salt

Paprika (just a little bit)

1 cup half and half

1 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded

8 oz. Penne pasta

1 tablespoon dried basil

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes (at least, add more to taste)

1/2 cup reserved cooked pasta water (or more)

Instructions:

Note: if using sun-dried tomatoes in oil (in a jar), make sure to drain sun-dried tomatoes from oil, before using them. Reserve 2 tablespoons of this drained oil for sauteing as described below: In a large pan, on high heat, sautee garlic and sundried tomatoes (drained from oil) in 2 tablespoons of oil (reserved from the sun-dried tomatoes jarsee note above) for 1 minute until garlic is fragrant. Remove sun-dried tomatoes from the pan, leaving the oil, and add chicken tenders, salted and lightly covered in paprika (for color) and cook on high heat for 1 minute on each side. Remove from heat.

Cook pasta according to package instructions. Reserve some cooked pasta water. Drain and rinse the pasta with cold water (to stop cooking). Slice sun-dried tomatoes into smaller bits and add them back to the skillet with chicken. Add half and half and cheese to the skillet, too, and bring to a gentle boil. Immediately reduce to simmer and cook, constantly stirring, until all cheese melts and creamy sauce forms. If the sauce is too thick - don't worry - you'll be adding some cooked pasta water soon. Add cooked pasta to the skillet with the creamy sauce, and stir to combine. Add 1 tablespoon of basil, and at least 1/4 teaspoon of red pepper flakes. Stir to combine.

Add about 1/2 cup reserved cooked pasta water because the creamy sauce will be too thick (do not add all water at once - you might need less or more of it). This will water down the thickness of the cheese sauce and make it creamier. Immediately, season the pasta with salt and more red pepper flakes, to taste, if needed. Let it simmer for a couple of minutes for flavors to combine.

Note: Make sure to salt the dish just enough to bring out of the flavors of basil and sun-dried tomatoes.

SEWING TIPS AND TRICKS

ACRONYMS FOR QUILTING:

FQ Fat quarter

HST Half square triangle

- 1. When sewing binding on by hand, tie a knot about every 10 stitches so if the stitches come loose, the entire binding is not at risk.
- Instead of discarding large used mailing envelopes, punch holes along one edge to fit a three-ring binder. Use the envelopes to store patterns and templates. Attach a photocopy or sketch of the block or project to the outside of the envelope so you can quickly identify the contents.
- For every quilt you make, consider also creating a repair kit. Just place pieces of the quilt fabric, binding, and a square of batting in a plastic bag and give it to the person receiving the quilt.
