#### JULY 11, 2016 - MINUTES

New members were recognized, and many guests introduced. Linda Brimanson, Membership Chair, added that she had received dues for 7 members, 5 new and 2 renewals. Connie thanked greeters Linda and June Dale and the Quilt of Valor members for providing refreshments.

July birthdays were announced, and C.C. will bring fat quarters to the next meeting. Mattie Johnson said

her birthday is March 1 st and not July 25 th as shown. Carolyn Sweet made a motion to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter, Carol Graham seconded, and the vote passed.

Connie gave thanks from the board to Terry Patterson for completing the guild directory. She has received some changes and will print them in the next newsletter. She asked anyone with changes to give them to Linda tonight. Dawn Hopkins announced her shop has moved and Connie mentioned the new address was listed in the advertising section of the newsletter.

Connie made an announcement for the Activities Committee for members to tell Becky Knauer if they will not turn in an entry for the Challenge, and if the entry will be larger than 150" perimeter so the number of poles and curtains can be determined. Members should place entries in a plain paper bag with the destination and cabin number shown (included on ticket) and a covered label. Members are asked to dress in tropical garb for the August Luau and to bring a covered dish.

Connie turned the meeting over to Colleen Sain for the Quilt of Valor Presentations. Colleen gave some information about the formation of the guild's QOV committee. They are called the Creative Piecers to recognize the contributions made by We're Sew Creative. Address is 6900 Hickory Ridge Road and the workshop will be from 9am to 3pm. Donations will be taken for block kits, or members can bring fabric or their projects to work on.

Ona also gave information about the September 12 th Program with Shannon Shirley of Once in a Rabbit Moon who will give an Introduction to Free Motion Quilting. Members were asked to sign up for both the September and October programs tonight. Ona asked for Deb Heatherly's workshop samples and said she heard many good comments about the workshop and asked members if they would like to have Deb give another workshop with her new products next year. After a show of hands, Ona decided she would contact Deb to set up another workshop. Dawn Hopkins talked about her new storefront location. She is having a notions sale to reduce the inventory as she has a smaller space.

Suzanne Hege won the raffle prize and several items were displayed for Show and Tell. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.


