## Minutes August 8, 2016

Connie reported on new members from last month in the last newsletter. Connie told members the charm squares and notices at each place setting were from Pineapple Fabrics. She thanked them and said they contacted her to see how many were expected to attend the meeting. Connie has ideas for the remaining gifts she said she would discuss later.

Connie thanked the Activities Committee members – Sara Bemus, Diane Thayer, Rebecca Knauer and the newest member of the group, Darlene Woodham - for tonight's program. Candy McManaway and Debbie Robb also helped with the quilt stands for the challenge quilts.

Table numbers were drawn to start dinner, and a matching game and voting sheets for challenge quilts kept everyone busy during the luau.

After dinner Connie announced the August birthdays and we sang Happy Birthday to Phyllis Grass whose birthday was today. C.C. Estey asked members with July birthdays to see her for their fat quarter. Tom Richardson made a motion to approve the July meeting minutes presented in the newsletter, Marguerite Klaiber seconded, and the vote passed for approval of the minutes.

Melba Mick reported the vendor area is full. She asked members to sign up for quilt show positions and to see Stephanie Newbrough with quilt entry forms. Stephanie Hutchison has created a Facebook fan page and a group page for the quilt show. Barbara Hinson reported vendor fees pay for the building rental and asked members to post show flyers everywhere to increase the attendance. She reported 14 raffle baskets are ready and each member working at the show will receive a free ticket. C.C. reported on all the free advertising she has obtained and that she has a meeting set up to place an article in the Independent Tribune. Melba reminded members quilt turn in is from 6-8 pm at Poplar Grove Baptist Church Family Life Building.

Connie asked members to turn in raffle quilt ticket stubs and money to her tonight as Nancy Miller was not able to attend. She also has ticket packages for members who have not picked up tickets yet. Connie also introduced Paige as the young girl Connie helped make a bear. Stephanie announced she had received 158 forms for quilts for the show and asked to have any other forms given to her tonight.

## New Project Port Pillows for Northeast Medical

## Instructions for Port Pillows:

- (2) 7x4 pieces of fabric
- (1) 5/8 Velcro 4" strip

Machine baste one side of Velcro to right side of fabric, fuzzy/loopy side up. Stitch only one end of Velcro, leaving the other end free. Baste other half of Velcro strip to opposite side of fabric, loopy side down. Put fabric pieces right sides together and make a 1/4-inch seam all the way around, leaving an opening about  $1 \frac{1}{2} - 2$  inches at one end. Be sure not to catch the "free" ends of the Velcro in the seam. Turn right side out and stuff. Whip stitch opening to finish. Ta Da!
