FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Welcome back! Since we weren't able to get together in January, February is going to start our 2017 with a bang! We have some exciting programs ahead of us thanks to Charlotte Doyle and Ona Phillips. Hopefully you had a chance to study the new budget. Even though we thought we were going to have a deficit in 2016, we came within \$500 of making our goal. We had a successful quilt show in many ways. As you can see, we made a profit but money doesn't measure our success in what we accomplished. We have put ourselves out in the public in a positive way with our publicity. When I talk to guests and new members, many of them say their first experience was through our quilt show. I have had such a positive feedback all the way from our Quilts of Valor presentation, Carolyn Sweet's presentation, our Community Outreach contributions, down to Merle Clifford putting our smallest scraps together to make 25 Hospice quilts. Our successes are numbered by the willingness of all of you to make a difference.

In looking ahead, it is not too early to start planning for 2018. Please look at ways you might be able to continue our success. A committee needs to be formed for the 2018 Raffle Quilt. We need you to think about the role you might play in the 2018 Quilt Show, especially the chairperson. Working with Melba Mick now would certainly be the best training in continuing this successful program. We still need to fill the positions for the nominating committee for the board positions for 2018. Barbara Henson has volunteered to take the position of Vice President and is being mentored by Cecilia Estey. Having training time with the present board person or committee chairperson allows for a much easier transition into the 2018 Cabarrus Quilters Guild board and chair responsibilities. Please give some serious thought as to how you might contribute to

ensure the continuation of our wonderful programs. "It takes a village" as I learned this past year.

I know that some of you have already started making bears. At this time we may have close to 50 bears done - half done by Nancy Miller. Tom and I want to involve as many people as we can in producing our goal of 100 bears to give to Victory Junction (www.victoryjunction.org) in May for their campers. As was noted in the e-mail reminder in January, we would like to create an assembly line so that many of you can help without necessarily having to create the whole bear. We can rely on everyone's talents. We will do this first workshop on Saturday, February 11th at Covenant Christian Church at 6900 Hickory Ridge Road, Harrisburg from 9:00am to 3:00pm. You can come to suit your schedule – part of the time to all of the time. Tom and I will be there to assist. Fabric and kits will be provided but you can bring your own fabric to be used with the black and white check if you wish. If you don't wish to bring your machine bring hand sewing items.

Charlotte and Ona's "Beginning Workshop" will be at Epworth United Methodist Church on Saturday, February 18th from 9:00 to 12:00pm. There is an itinerary listed under the program section. Check out all the year's programs listed under the "Program" section. Since we added 25 new people, some of them first time quilters, we saw a need to do this. There are also many of us who could benefit from refresher lessons either done as different approaches or just reminders. It is a good time to get together and share. Since this will be over by 12 oclock, we could collect and go to lunch. There is no cost for this workshop. Another idea to help our new members is to offer to become a mentor. A mentor is a good way to help the new members become connected by answering questions or connect them to other members who may be of

help. Think how many times a topic is discussed that we take for granted, and a new member wouldn't have a clue as to its reference. As new members are being introduced, consider volunteering to offer this valuable service and let me know you are willing so I can make sure everyone is connected.

It has been my privilege so far to be a part of such a wonderful group of people. You have certainly made my position as your President much easier and I am looking forward to the rest of 2017. Just a side thought: I am not sure how many of you take New Year's Resolutions seriously (You can probably judge how far you have gotten since it is now February) but I thought I would add one that I think about. When you eat, someone said to me: "Eat breakfast like a king, lunch like a queen, and supper like a pauper." Like I said, I'm thinking about it.
