From the President – May 2017

I am always amazed at the contributions and the willingness to give. I asked for quilt tops for hospice and we got quilt tops. Tom and I have been out of town, renting a house in Nags Head; no quilting, only fun and games with our whole family. Now we are back to quilting but have a collection of 25 quilts to be quilted. We will probably get 6 done before the meeting but at the rate we're going and your willingness to contribute, we probably have a second career. The Guild has donated 23 guilts to Hospice so far this year. I have attended the Tuesday workshop at Wesleyan Church in Kannapolis and I see more Hospice quilts in the works. If anyone would volunteer to quilt some tops, we will furnish the batting and probably most of the backing since many of you responded when we called for backing.

We also have 104 bears completely finished and ready to go. We also have an additional 8 bears to be closed and another 8 to be stuffed and closed. We will save these for the quilt show and as a start for next year. Thank you for all of your contributions. At this time we don't have a fixed date for the visitation to Victory Junction but will probably have it for the meeting.

I have heard conversations of other projects you are involved in, for example the million pillow case challenge. Debbie Morse has information about this. I will have a sign-up sheet at the next meeting and I would like you to list other charity projects you are doing so I can report in the next newsletter or send me the information at clrich39@gmail.com. Don't forget that on May 12th and 26th (Friday) we can work charity projects at Fire Station #9 - Workdays for Hospice etc. Quilts, Friday, May 12. and Friday,

May 26. 2017, 10AM-4 PM, 1020 Ivey Cline Road, Concord, NC (just off Poplar Tent Road and I85).

Terry Patterson will be finishing the last of the pictures for the directory in our May meeting. It is very helpful to have your picture since we are growing at a rapid rate. On Wednesday, April 26th there was a Quilts of Valor ceremony at Jay Robinson High School. Many of our guild members are a part of this group. On the Quilt of Valor Presentation, Colleen Sain said "we awarded 11 quilts to Veterans. Three of the Veterans were served during WWII. The rest served in Vietnam and Iraq. The Jay Robinson JROTC presented the flags and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. Each veteran selected the quilt that spoke to them and families were enlisted to assist with the wrapping of the quilt. One of the quilts was created by Rosemary Halliday who lives in Australia. She makes one quilt each year for the QOV Foundation to thank the Marines who kept Australia safe from the Japanese in WWII." These ceremonies remind us to be thankful for the service to our country that these veterans have done. They make it possible for us to live in freedom and allow us the freedom to quilt.

Reminder: Plan to join us at Wesleyan Church in Kannapolis on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month and at the Poplar Tent fire station on the 2nd and 4th Friday of the month of May. Friendships are sewn one stitch at a time.

LAST MEETING MINUTES

Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting April 10, 2017

President Connie Richardson opened the meeting at 6:45pm and asked those in attendance to let Tom Richardson know if they do not receive reminder emails or newsletters. She has been calling members that have not renewed for 2017. C.C. introduced guests and Connie asked new members Cynthia Belkin, Susan Odom and Martha Lukas to stand and tell the group where they live and where they are from if different. Connie acknowledged April birthdays and thanked greeters Barbara Hinson and Phyllis Moysan and refreshment providers JoAnna Cupp, Becky Knauer, Sara Bemus, Martha Austin and Joan Soeth. She asked for changes to March Minutes printed in the newsletter. Colleen Sain made a motion to accept the minutes, Marguerite Klaiber seconded, and a vote approved the minutes.

Ona Phillips said batting pieces donated by Rebecca Verrier-Watt were in the back of the room and asked if anyone recognized a QOV pillowcase. She mentioned that Charlotte Doyle had donated fabric for members to use for Hospice quilts and brought some other fabrics not suitable for quilts tonight for anyone to take. Ona reminded members to sign up and pay for May machine appliqué workshop with Judy Heyward and June "Homage to Our Flag" workshop with Annette Ornelas. Ona then introduced Bonnie Shropshire for her lecture "Follow Your Dreams". Bonnie & husband Jerry live in Dobson, NC and displayed many quilts using her no-sew stained glass method that she will demonstrate in the workshop tomorrow.

After the program Charlotte made an announcement about a Free Hospice workshop to be held at Fire Station # 9 in the community room on Fridays May 12th & May 26th from 10-4pm. The address is 1020 Ivy Kline Road off Poplar Tent and I85. Debbie Morse then showed two quilts that will be included in the Silent Auction – a Dresden Plate that Cathey Hooper quilted and Parasol Ladies that a group is

hand quilting every other Monday at Crescent Heights Assisted Living on Branchview. Anyone interested in helping with the hand quilting should see Melba Mick for more information. Debbie gave members some detail about the Silent Auction process and said beginning in May UFO's and will be collected and available for members that wish to complete donated items. Completed items will also be collected. Debbie then showed Hospice quilts that will be delivered this week. Carla Garceau, nominations chair, passed around a signup sheet for anyone interested in volunteering to be an officer or chair beginning in December 2017. The nominating committee and officers will be contacting anyone interested and will be available to answer questions about responsibilities after the meeting tonight. Connie said sew dates at First Wesleyan in Kannapolis are April 11th & April 25th. Additional lighting is recommended and \$5 per month will be collected for a monthly \$50 donation to the church. Connie reported on Victory Junction Bears and asked if anyone would be interested in a Saturday visit to the camp. The date will be after the May guild meeting. A total of 91 bears are completed and kits and bears to be stuffed will be brought to the First Wesleyan Church and Hospice fabric will be available. Connie announced that June Dale will be moving the 1st of June and a Guild Librarian is needed to take her place. Raffle Tickets are available from Colleen Sain and Connie said a donation of \$1,000 will be sent to CVAN for 2016 sales. Connie reminded members to put their name in the drawing if they had not already and they completed all guild requirements in 2016. A drawing for a \$50 gift certificate will be later in the evening.

After a break, Melba said Natalie Swilley is taking guild T-shirt and tote bag orders and orders placed by Thursday of this week will be delivered at the May meeting. Darlene Woodward asked members to be sure to pick up Clue 3 for the Mystery Quilt due in June, and reminded members that there is a category for guild projects to be entered in the quilt show. Melba will check with Stephanie Newbrough to see when 2017 quilt show entry forms will be available. Members who sent a picture of their front door can pick up a stamp, and if they have not

sent a picture, send by April 28th . A stamp is available if a 12" block was brought to the meeting. There are instructions available for the May activity to turn the traditional block into a non-traditional quilt. Peggy Hadley won the activity drawing for those that brought their Clue 2 Mystery blocks or donations for the Activity store. A parade of blocks started Show and Tell. Sylvia Stancil won the 2016 drawing of completion of guild responsibilities and Stephanie Mayes won the Door prize drawing. Meeting adjourned at 8:35pm.

UPCOMING WORKSHOPS*

May Workshop

Our May Lecture/Workshop will be with Judy Heyward, a former Houston winner.

From Judy: This class will cover the basics of making quilt tops with fusible appliqué techniques—including the use of an appliqué pressing sheet, tracing paper, wonder-under and other tools to prepare the design fabrics for fusing to the background fabric.

Afterwards, we will talk about using tear-away stabilizer for stitching and emphasizing the overall effect the same fabrics that were fused earlier.

There are many methods of appliqueing but this is my favorite. Using the proper tools can provide excellent results very quickly and I hope you enjoy it as much as I do.

June Workshop

Our June Workshop, titled "Waves of Glory" will be given by Annette Ornelas

She will teach us:

Dimensional Curved Piecing or Peeled-Back Patchwork: an easy way to get curved designs using dimensional curved piecing.

Pre-cutting instructions will be made available in advance so that all students are ready to sew. Free-form piecing: No measuring - exciting results!

ACTIVITIES

Bring in the project for May, which was to take your 12" traditional quilt block and turn it into a non-traditional project. It does NOT have to be completed. Receive a stamp!! (If you thought to take a picture of the traditional block before you cut it up, bring for display.)

If you sent in a picture of your front door, pick up that stamp.
