Connie asked for corrections to the May minutes and Charlotte Doyle made a motion to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter, Melba seconded and after a vote, the minutes passed as printed. UPCOMING WORKSHOPS* <u>July Workshop</u>

"Dangerous Curves" With Ricki Selva

In the workshop, quilters will master the skill of sewing a curved seam on the sewing machine to yield a flat block with a smooth, graceful appearance by working first with the Drunkard's Path block.

Then we will apply this mastery to the dangerous world of piecing without templates.

Supply List:

Sewing machine with a fresh needle (and spares) and a foot for patchwork. (Note: If you have a Singer Featherweight please bring it, you will be glad you did.)

Power strip and extension cord

Neutral (grey/tan/taupe) colored thread

Bobbins full of neutral colored thread

Seam ripper-The bigger the handle, the better

Thread snips

Small (28mm) rotary cutter with a new sharp blade

Rotary Mat (about 18 x 24 or larger)

Fabric: Bring a selection of 6-8 fat quarters that look good together...A large scale multi colored print, coordinated with maybe a plaid, an abstract design, a tiny print, a batik, a novelty. (In other words...One "focus fabric" and a couple of "Gowiths.") Be sure you have fabric that is dark and some that is light, along with your mediums.

Also, please bring some *scraps* 5" x 5" or larger, bring at least 8, pressed neatly, ready to cut.
