FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

This is my last newsletter as your president. I didn't realize what I was getting into when I took this on but I am glad that I did it. This would not have been an easy job if it had not been for such a committed group of people who took on individual committee positions. It's a team that makes a group successful, not an individual. Every one of you, whether being on a committee or not, made such a difference. There is a constant reminder in Tom's and my "to do" box of quilt tops you have given us to be quilted. I know that as individuals, many organizations benefit from your contributions. The ones Tom and I feel close to are hospice and Victory Junction. Without Nancy Miller's help this year (she made half of the bears last year to help us reach our goal of 100), every bear you make really helps. At this time we have about 20 bears completed for 2018, 50 kits are ready for assembly, and four VJ quilts completed and about half a dozen ready to be guilted. The Concord Fire Station has been great to allow us the space to work on these projects. On Friday, we had twelve people working on various charity projects.

To date, there have been 86 quilts donated to Hospice and 21 more are ready to be turned in. What an accomplishment!

Another event that showed a strong team effort was our last quilt show. Melba and Stephanie did a great job in organizing this event and it could not have been done without the volunteer effort of all of you. Congratulations to all the many winners and to all who added to the beautiful display. This event was a great gift to the community. (You can see all of the winning quilts by visiting the Cabarrus Quilters' website.) There were many good displays and booths. They all deserve recognition but it would make this newsletter too long. However, there are three I want to recognize. One is the beautiful display done by the activity committee show casing the charity projects done by the guild. I worked in

the White Elephant booth and I saw many people, both guild members and non-members spending time looking at the pictures. This was great advertising. Another is the Quilts of Valor Presentation. This event is always an emotional experience and one that allows us to say thank you to the men who served to insure our freedon. The third booth was the one done by Pat Arnt. Sharing her talents also brought many admiring comments both for her and for the guild. I remember the guilt shown in the picture behind her head when she entered it in a previous quilt show. The reason I remember it is that it was a representation of a "migrane". When I saw this, it was a look into my childhood of my mother and the migrane headaches she had. This allowed me to connect with her with a little more understanding. We all have intreprations of the various quilts we see and allows a form of communication that often words can't say. Thank you, Pat for sharing your talents.



I think one of the best blessings for me in being your president for the past two years was that it allowed me to get to know all of you, not just a small core group. I feel that I have added so many new friends in the past two years. Coming from the Midwest which was always my home until 7 years ago. I now call this home, thanks to all of my friends. LAST MEETING MINUTES

Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday, October 9, 2017

President Connie Richardson began the meeting early at 6:35pm as there was a lot to do tonight. She welcomed everyone and wished all a Happy Columbus Day. She recognized and thanked those who worked Saturday at judging of quilts and especially Shelley Lenhousen who stepped in for Jane Hall who was sick. New member in September Kathy Coble was recognized and Connie mentioned no new members tonight. Jim Lemon was introduced as a guest. Cecilia (C.C.) Estey, Vice President, was the greeter tonight and refreshments were provided by Natalie Swilley, Kathy Lock, Peggy Overcash, Lisa Schrect and Julie Love, Connie asked for additional volunteers for the November meeting. October birthdays were announced and reminded to pick up a fat quarter, along with members with September birthdays that were not able to attend the late meeting. Connie asked for corrections to September minutes and Charlotte Doyle made a motion to approve, Mattie Johnson seconded, and the minutes were accepted

with a vote. Charlotte Doyle announced a Charity Sew Date Friday October 27th at the Fire Station on Poplar Tent Road & I85 from 9-4. She also reminded members that CVAN Cuddle Quilts, as required per guild by-laws, were to be turned in at the November meeting. The December program would be the Christmas Party and new program co-chairs would start in January. Charlotte then introduced Levi Henson with his lecture "Quilts and Their Stories" and encouraged members to share their quilt stories while he told the story of his quilts.

After the presentation, Tami drew for prizes and gift certificates. Melba Mick thanked all volunteers that worked the past weekend and asked members that have not already signed up for a specific area at the quilt show to see Stephanie Newbrough during break. C.C. asked anyone who would be interested in making a t-shirt quilt to see her for the name of a woman who had come in earlier. Tom Richardson announced BJ's membership renewals are due and the guild membership cost is \$30 so anyone interested should see him tonight. A Mary Kerr Trunk Show will be held November 18th in Salisbury at 11am and more information will be in the newsletter.

After the break, Darlene Woodham reminded everyone to add names and number of stamps, including stamps for project quilts entered in the quilt show, to the list at the Activities table for November store purchases. We began the activity using the 2 1/2" strip and ripping along straight of grain to see how many strips could be made. A strip-off produced several winners and the scraps were gathered to be made into dog beds. Connie named the officers nominated and a vote will take place at the November meeting. Hospice, Victory Junction and Silent Auction items were shown by Debbie Morse. Show & Tell items were displayed, including the quilt Anna Lopez entered in the Asheville Quilt Show and the Pineapple Fabric kit Sarah Presson completed. Melba reminded

everyone a Quilt of Valor presentation will be held at the quilt show on Saturday at 11 am. Charlotte won the door prize.

The meeting adjourned at 9:07pm.

QUILTING TIPS

If you are like me & need deadlines, Joanna Cupp gave me this tip. On the website, allpeoplequilt.com you can sign up for a UFO challenge, list 12 items, & every month a random # will be assigned to be completed. Joanna told me she finished 18 (I think that is the #) quilts and this is free. I am using the form for 2017 to get started & will start again in 2018. Many of you asked how I had completed so many quilts. I have signed up for We're Sew Creative's UFO challenge as incentive to finish some of my kits. I also do not give away quilts until after they have been in our show, and maybe earned a ribbon (& some \$\$\$). When I quit my full time job 5 years ago, my goal was to exercise more & finish a lot of the quilt kits I had purchased during my travels. Problem is it takes less time to buy fabric or a kit than it does to sew so I now have twice as many UFOs as I did at the end of 2012! Debbie Morse


