Some of the members also worked on Quilts of Valor and Hospice guilts.







Debbie Moorse shared that we have delivered 75 quilts to Hopice and Pallative Care in Cabarrus County and have 5 more ready to go. Tom's long arm has just been rejuvenated so he is ready to work on the tops that you have donated. You have been most generous in your donations of tops. Thank you. We had a great time working together on the 29th and have 40 bear kits ready to be sewn, plus the other projects making headway. The picture of the Dog Quilt was material from Pineapple Fabric as well as the guilt made from sone of the charm packs. We will be able to put together at least 3 more quilts from those 9 patches. Trudy's picture is a good representation of how much fun we had working together. We had a great time. I wish to thank Janneke Bahamon for sitting with Tom in preparation for doing the Newsletter in 2018-19.

We should have some cooler weather ahead, so enjoy. See you October 9th for our next regular meeting weather permitting!!

Quilt Drop Off: Reminder that quilt drop off is Friday October 6th from 5-7pm at Poplar Grove Baptist Church in the gym. The address is 3476 Poplar Tent Rd, Concord, NC 28027. If you are unable to bring your quilts to drop of please make prior arrangements with someone else in the guild to bring them for you. Judging is the very next day so quilts must be turned in Friday night, no exceptions. Also, remember to have each quilt labeled with at least the quilt name, your name, and telephone number. Labels should be already covered with a piece of fabric or muslin so that no one can read the label during judging. Plan to stay with your quilts until they are all identified and labeled with their correct quilt show judging label.

Quilt Judging: If you are signed up to be a part of judging please remember to be at the church (same place as drop off the night before) by 8 am. This will allow us enough time to get everyone into place and prepared to begin judging the first quilts at 8:30. We have a lot of quilts/categories to judge that day we do not want to get started late. Lunch will be provided that day for those working during judging.

Quilt Show, Setup, and Take Down: We do still have numerous slots that do not have anyone signed up to work yet. We really do need all hands on deck in order to get the show off and running every year. Please take a minute to look over the signup sheets and help anywhere and everywhere you can. LAST MEETING MINUTES

Cabarrus Quilters Guild

Minutes of General Membership Meeting

Monday, September 18, 2017

(Regular meeting September 11th cancelled due to Hurricane Irma)

President Connie Richardson began the meeting at 6:42pm explaining she was out of town last week due to a family emergency in Georgia that turned into a celebration of Tom's birthday Thursday. She recognized last month's new member Anna Lopez who was not at the meeting, and Cecelia Estey introduced new member Cathy Coble. Connie thanked Carol Eicher, Trudy Pollard, Pat Ott, Esta

Wannamaker, Diana Gange & Cindy Palazzo for providing the refreshments. She read a list of September birthdays and C.C. reminded all to pick up a fat quarter. C.C. is also selling door prize tickets tonight. Connie noted a correction in the August meeting minutes for quilt show dates to show October and not September. With no other changes, Tom motioned to accept the corrected minutes, Ona Phillips seconded, and a vote was taken to approve the minutes.

Darlene Woodham gave an update on the 2018 raffle quilt. Shelley Lenhousen is quilting and Darlene hopes to recognize everyone involved with the quilt at the December meeting. Debbie Morse announced the 2018-2019 slate of officers and program co-chairs Johnnie McCallum and Darlene Woodham, and asked committee volunteers to contact Barbara Hinson. Barbara stated she would like to have two more volunteers for the Activities committee.

QUILT SHOW: Stephanie Newbrough said judge scribes and runners are needed and she has signup sheets at her table. She reminded everyone quilt turn in is Friday, October 6th at Poplar Tent Baptist Church from 5-7pm. Volunteers need to be at the church at 8am and the judging will start at 8:30. 202 quilt forms were received and 194 will be judged. Ouilt show set up will start at 8am at the Cabarrus Arena and continue until all set up is done. More volunteers are needed for set up and take down Saturday at the end of the show. Marguerite Klaiber asked for volunteers to help with White Elephant donations Thursday, September 21st & Friday September 22nd at her house. Connie will send an email tomorrow with the address. Marguerite has received a large amount of donations, including 3 sewing machines. She needs help measuring, tagging, and pricing all items. Signup sheets are at the front table. Marguerite said a bonus is available for volunteers as they are able to make early purchases. Debbie showed some Silent Auction items and thanked everyone who has completed items. All items for the show should be completed and turned in by the October 9th guild meeting. Barbara was asked to give an update on the 2018 quilt trip to Missouri Star. She has brochures and Tami will give a presentation at the October

meeting and take deposits for a \$30 discount. Members can mail a check payable to Christian Tours to Tami, or give to Barbara or Melba if they will not be at the October meeting. Connie reported Dawn Hopkins has scheduled a retreat at Camp Caraway on April 8-11th in 2018, the week after Easter. A decision must be made soon. Dawn has reserved 10 rooms and a 25% deposit is due by October 3rd. Prices are single \$330 (\$82.50 deposit) and double \$295 (\$73.95 deposit). Charlotte Doyle has made arrangements for a sew date for September 29th at Fire Station #9 on Poplar Tent & I85. Connie said this will be a day to sew Hospice quilts and make Victory Junction bears and quilts, using fabrics purchased from Anderson Sew & Sew using a grant for \$250 obtained by Carol Eicher. Carol said the project is called "Quilters on a Mission" and the seed money grant can be renewed every year and is intended to start the project that will be enhanced with the work of our members. Carol will have T-shirts available to the first members to show up, and will take pictures throughout the day to show the projects made with the fabrics purchased. She asked everyone to bring projects they have started. Connie said many

options will be available to those that attend and not everyone will need to bring sewing machines. Connie will send the address for the Fire Station. Connie will send an email to all members with information about White Elephant volunteer days. September 29th Quilters on a Mission day and April 2018 Quilt Retreat.

The Activities committee asked for pictures of last the 2016 Christmas meeting. Connie displayed Hospice and Victory Junction guilts that need binding, and Debbie displayed completed Hospice quilts donated tonight. Members displayed Show & Tell items. 
