One of the founding members of our quilt guild, Fay Esther White West, passed away at the age of 91 on Thursday, Nov. 9, 2017. The service was held November 13th at Whitley's Funeral Home in Kannapolis, and the burial was at Carolina Memorial Park Cemetery. She owned and operated Grandma's Quilt Shop for 10 years. She was the founder and president of the Happy Quilter's Club which is now the Cabarrus Quilter's Guild. She was a certified quilt teacher and judge. She judged for the Master's Guild with the National Quilting Association.

- 8. Easy blocks
- 9. ½ square triangles
- 10. Stitch in the ditch

#### ACTIVITIES

#### MUG RUG SWAP

The first activity of the year is a Mug Rug Swap due at the January Guild Meeting. If you came to the December meeting, you got a recipient's name to make the mug rug for. However, if you did not make it to the meeting, you are still able to participate. You need to bring a completed mug rug in a Ziploc baggie to the January Guild Meeting. Detailed instructions of the Mug Rug Swap are below:

WHAT AND HOW TO MAKE A MUG RUG? It's a mini quilt - top, batting, backing, & bound (finished edges). Mug rugs are various sizes ranging from 4" X 7" to as large as 12" X 8". A quilter can fit more detail onto a mug rug and have more fun creating them. Instant gradification & done in an evening.

WHAT ARE MUG RUGS USED FOR? Protect table/furniture from plants, pots, or condesation from non-tervis cups, or hot beverages. Add an accent of pretty to your dressing table; adorn a coffee table, desk, or workspace; use on hall conole table to rest car keys. Every room in the house can find a space for these functional little quilts.

WHY MAKE A MUG RUG? (1) use up scraps, (2) test out fabrics for next projects, (3) skill building: try new techniques, (4) practice free-motion quilting, and (5) gifts: roll up a mug rug, place into a mug....instant gift. Just a few ideas.

#### **CONSTRUCTION GUIDELINES:**

**FABRIC:** good, quality, quilt shop worthy, 100% cotton.

**SIZE:** at least 4" X 7", no larger than 12". It's a mini quilt - top, batting, backing, & bound (finished edges). Quilt as desired.

**SHAPE:** round, square, oval, oblong, triangular, hexagonal, octagonal; various shapes such as a cupcake or a coffee cup. Endless possibilities....let your imagination soar!!!

**TECHNIQUE:** to include, but not limited to handpieced, machine pieced, embroidered, paper-pieced, quilt-as-you-go, or appliqued.

Let Go and Have Fun.....Just make sure you make and swap a creation YOU would want to receive.

**DUE DATE:** January Guild Meeting. Bring completed mug rug in a ziploc baggie with recipient's name placed in or on baggie.
