Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday Nov. 12, 2018

President Barbara Hinson began the meeting at 6:30. She thanked everyone who came out in the rain. Melba Mick made a motion to pass the October minutes and Marguerite Klaiber second the motion. There were three visitors, Mary Shea, Delores Swartz and Dot Garland. Natalie Swilley said she would start taking the membership dues in December and they are due in January. The dues are \$35. Karen Swart named the November

Darleen Woodhem introduced Rebecca Moffit from CVAN. She was very impressed with the amount and beauty of the quilts that the guild provides. In 1996 is when the guild started donating the quilts. She spoke about the center and how they help the abused women and children. The stay at their center is about two months. They receive about one hundred and fifty calls a month. There are one third to one half women abused each year in the United States. There was a show and tell on the CVAN quilts that was donated this month.

Genevieve Van Loan gave a report on the quilt show. We made a profit of \$75.70. Genevieve needs three people to help her with the audit in January.

Julie Love spoke about the Christmas party and gave a hint that everyone should watch It's a Wonderful Life before the meeting. You can either bring food to donate or give a cash donation. The 2019 quilt show will be at Gibson Mill. It will be held the 18th and 19th of October. White elephant and silent auction will be held together.

Martha Austin donated the sewing machine she won. There will be a drawing and the tickets will be \$2. each. They will go on sale in January. She hopes this makes a little profit for the guild.

Connie Richardson said November 30th at the fire station between 9am to 4pm. You can work on any charity project. She thanked everyone for the donated quilts. Carol Eicher donated \$250 this year.

Colleen Sain spoke about the QOV presentations and how nice they were. Karen Knapp thanked everyone who brought books for the orphanage. She said they also need pillow cases for the home

Phyllis Moysan won the door prize. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND UPCOMING CHARITY EVENTS

Since we are coming close to the end of the year, I thought I would update the contributions that we have made to Hospice and to Victory Junction for 2018. Debbie Morse has delivered 74 quilts to Cabarrus County Hospice and Palliative Care this year. Tom and I have delivered 60 quilts and 117 bears to Victory Junction and have a dozen each of quilts and bears ready for 2019. Thank you for all of those who have made contributions to these two organizations. Carol Eicher's husband allowed us to use his \$250 money from Trivent Financial to purchase six ten lb. boxes of stuffing to stuff bears in 2019 and the rest of the money was spent for thread for Tom's longarm. Rebecca Verrier-Watt gave us a hefty roll of black batting that can be used for darker charity quilts, and three bolts of wide backing. All of these contribution plus all of the contributions from our members have allowed us to become known as a guild that gives back to the community.




