ACTIVITIES

THE PAINT CHIP CHALLENGE

The Paint Chip Challenge will be a catagory in this year's quilt show. This is a very popular guild Challenge to get quilter's out of one's color comfort zone by using different palettes of color not normally chosen.

Don't look at this as a task of drudgery.....this is an exercise to kindle the flames of your imagination. Engage a new technique. Produce a new block. Discover decorative stitches. Use another template. Try a different ruler. Put aside your regular notions; get adventurous by using some of those new gadgets, patterns, books, and other accessories you've purchased and haven't used. This is the prime opportunity to introduce yourself to a new tool.

• Each paint chip card contains three (3) or four (4) colors. These are the DOMINANT colors of your project. The COMBINATION OF BOTH cards

must be 50% of the project, hence, The Paint Chip Challenge.

- Large scale prints, small scale prints, tonals, abstracts, batiks, prints that read as solids, one-way designs, stripes, etc......Whatever fabric used should be as true to the paint chip colors as possible.
- In addition to your paint chip cards, pull from your stash, use other coordinating fabrics. The use of neutrals, such as black, white, gray, and/or beige may be used to segway into your fabric schemes.
- You may construct any type of quilt. Create what makes you feel good. This is your quilt after the challenge.
- Project measurements: minimum 24" X 24" (96" perimeter), maximum 48" X 48" (192" perimeter)
- The quilt must have a top, batting, and backing (3 layers). Any quilting method may be used.
- The quilt must also be bound and labeled.
- The Challenge quilts are due at the August picnic meeting. The paint chip cards must be displayed with the project at the August meeting and the CCQG quilt show
- Have fun with it!!!!

A Viewer's Choice voting will take place at the August picnic meeting and prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winners. So, in all fairness & friendly competiveness, PLEASE DO NOT SHARE PLANS OR SWAP COLORS WITH OTHERS.

We will also have between 30 and 40 completed quilts (depending on Tom being able to get a part for his long arm in time to finish approximately 15 quilts ready to be quilted.) All of this will be displayed at the May meeting.

The next sew date at fire station #9 will be Friday, April 27th from 9 to 4. This is the time you can work on any charity project of your choosing. I will have bear kits if you wish to work on them but these bears will be a start for next year. I will bring black and white checks for quilts and

batting if you tell me ahead of time how much you need. We have done some "quilt as you go" quilts in the past which works well for hospice quilts. You just need to bring strips of fabric. This is a good time to also start on your CVAN quilts. We always have a good time so hope to see you there.

TRIP TO VICTORY JUNCTION CAMP GROUNDS

This trip has been scheduled **TUESDAY**, **MAY 15TH**, the day after the Monday meeting. We will be taking all the bears and quilts with us.
