QUILT SHOW- WHITE ELEPHANT BOOTH

Each year at our quilt show, the guild sponsors a booth of our own. It is a little like a tag sale for quilters and all profit goes to the guild. We sell new or gently used donated items of interest to quilters.

Marguerite Klaiber will be accepting donations for the booth from now through August. As you are doing your spring cleaning, please keep the White Elephant in mind. You can bring donations to guild meetings (look for her purple wagon there) or if you wish, arrange to bring them directly to her home.

Popular items include: thread, rulers, <u>quilt</u> patterns, books, magazines, 100% cotton fabric, tools, etc.

QUILT SHOW – SILENT AUCTION BOOTH

The 2018 Quilt Show will include a Silent Auction booth, with new quilted or fiber related items available for show attendees to place bids. Attendees will complete a card with their contact information and assigned a number to use for bidding. The cards will be hidden from public view-making this a "silent" auction. Bidding will end an hour before the show closes on Saturday, and the winning bidder will be contacted to pay for and take home item/items.

There will be a "Buy it Now" price posted, usually 3 times the minimum price shown on each bid sheet. Cash, credit cards, or checks are accepted for payment. Some large items may be raffled, with tickets sold and a drawing held at the same time bidding closes. All profits go to the guild.

Debbie Morse will be accepting donations of completed items and UFO's at guild meetings and sew dates and ask for volunteers to complete items. The latest time to turn in completed items will be the weekend before the show date to allow bid cards to be prepared. Terry Patterson and Julie Love have volunteered to set up the booth Thursday, September 20th, and sign up sheets to work 2 hour (or longer) shifts during the show will be posted at guild meeting prior to the show dates. COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND UPCOMING CHARITY EVENTS

The **JUNE** workshop at the Fire Station #9 will be Friday, June 29th from 9 to 4. You can work on any charity projects. Please let me know if you are interested in having a charity sew day in July or August, so we can send the reservation. Otherwise, we will wait until September. The interest in the Outreach Program has been strong for the Cabarrus Quilters Guild in the contributions made by the guild members. Members have contributed in many different ways. The contributions are making tops to be quilted, making bears, stuffing and closing them, applying bindings, donating fabric (especially backings) and quilting tops. There are so many members who were a part of an assembly line to complete these projects. We also have members who take the scraps from other

quilters and use them to make scrappy quilts. Merle Clifford has donated over 30 quilts doing this. Pat Cevaal can take some of the smallest pieces and make beautiful quilts. Pineapple Fabric needs to be recognized for their donated fabrics. Trivent Financial through Carol Eicher as the coordinator has donated \$250. to be used for batting in charity quilts. (One roll was given to Quilts of Valor.) Becky Anderson from Anderson's Sew and Sew has donated fabric for backings. Fire Station #9 generously provides space to work on charity projects once a month. Donated pieces of batting from Rebecca Verrier- Watt has allowed Tom to piece batting for quilts along with the purchased batting. Stephanie Mayes gave Tom a cone of Glide thread, the best used in his long-arm machine. I would be amiss not recognizing Tom for all the many hours he spends quilting the donated tops for Hospice and Victory Junction. This has encouraged the many donated tops from our members.

We had a very successful trip to the Victory Junction Camp site on May 15th. Fourteen of our members were given a tour of the grounds and felt the joy of handing over fruits of our labor, We donated 120 bears, and 54 quilt tops. (In addition, eight bears and six quilts were kept to display at the next Quilt Show.) 37 Hospice quilts have been donated so far this year. Now that the Victory Junction project can be put on hold until 2019, Tom will concentrate on quilting the tops for Hospice. (This is just a reminder that if you can keep the width down to 40 inches, the 42-44 width fabric can be used. However, we do have some donated wide backing.) At this point, we are good on backing material, although we can always use more masculine patterns and bright colors for the brighter tops but all donated fabrics will be put to good use. Except for thread and possible stuffing material for the 2019 bears for Victory Junction, additional expenses should be minimal. (We can always used donated stuffing.) It is not too early to remind you about your CVAN quilt due in November. New members, if you have question about this project, let me know and I will either answer them or put you in touch with a member who can. I will give a brief run down of the

Outreach Program at the June meeting and answer any of your questions. I would like to entertain any thoughts on future projects you may wish to do. Again, thank you for all you do. I am very proud to say I am a part of the Cabarrus Quilters Guild. I hope to see you at the June meeting. Connie Richardson
