# QUILT SHOW – SILENT AUCTION BOOTH

The 2018 Quilt Show will include a Silent Auction booth, with new quilted or fiber related items

available for show attendees to place bids. Attendees will complete a card with their contact information and assigned a number to use for bidding. The cards will be hidden from public view-making this a "silent" auction. Bidding will end an hour before the show closes on Saturday, and the winning bidder will be contacted to pay for and take home item/items.

There will be a "Buy it Now" price posted, usually 3 times the minimum price shown on each bid sheet. Cash, credit cards, or checks are accepted for payment. Some large items may be raffled, with tickets sold and a drawing held at the same time bidding closes. All profits go to the guild.

Debbie Morse will be accepting donations of completed items and UFO's at guild meetings and sew dates and ask for volunteers to complete items. The latest time to turn in completed items will be the weekend before the show date to allow bid cards to be prepared. Terry Patterson and Julie Love have volunteered to set up the booth Thursday, September 20th, and sign up sheets to work 2 hour (or longer) shifts during the show will be posted at guild meeting prior to the show dates. # LAST MEETING MINUTES

Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday, June 11, 2018

President Barbara Hinson began the meeting at 6:30 pm with a welcome to all. Jo Ann Hahn made a motion to accept the May meeting minutes printed in the newsletter, Marguerite Klaiber seconded, and the minutes were approved after a vote. Melba Mick announced a drawing for tickets and gas money to the Raleigh Expo for three. She is also selling chances for a door prize of embroidery designs. Karen Swart announced June birthdays and reminded all to collect their fat quarter. A drawing for birthday balloons went to Joanna Cupp and Mildred Lamb. She thanked all that provided snacks. She said the Kannapolis library invited the guild to a Friday or Saturday event and more info will be provided at a later date.

Natalie Swilley introduced two visitors. Barbara asked all members to pick up an envelope for a Quilt Study the University of California-San Diego is doing. Debbie Morse asked members to volunteer to set up the quilt and sell raffle tickets for the Mt. Pleasant Celebration to be held on June 23<sup>rd</sup> from 4-7pm. (this was later cancelled due to the quilt rack not available and night time dampness) Loretta Sirota of the Charlotte Modern Quilt Guild announced a lecture/workshop by Anita Grossman Solomon will

be held Thursday, July 26<sup>th</sup> & Friday July 27<sup>th</sup>. Cost for non-members is \$8. Loretta will send more information to the guild.

Darlene Woodham introduced Susan Pierce as our speaker for the evening. Susan said she designs patterns for Pineapple Fabrics who had just purchased Keepsake Quilting. She then gave a history of her quilts and the story behind each quilt. She suggested everyone document each quilt as your life story.


Announcements: Barbara said all members should have received a pdf file for the Houston International Quilt Show in October 2019. Travel bucks earned for the Missouri Star trip this year can be used for the 2019 trip. A presentation about the trip and discounted rates will be available for those who make a deposit at the October 8th meeting. After a short break, Barbara said free tickets to a concert June 21-24<sup>th</sup> were available.

Connie Richardson gave a recap of the Community Outreach results for Victory Junction – 52 quilts and 130 bears. She brought 12 Hospice quilts Tom quilted for binding. She asked members to include their name to be kept with the items until they are completed for recognition. The next Charity Sew date is June 29th at the Fire Station. After a show of hands, it was decided that no sew date will be held in July and August and the Charity Sew will start again in September. Tom will quilt Hospice Quilts now and Victory Junction donations will start next year. Connie asked anyone to bring ideas for other Community Outreach items for a member vote (for use of guild provided fabric and batting). Terry Patterson showed a reversible Comfort Cap for chemo patients that uses 2 pre-washed fat quarters and said to contact her for the pattern. Martha Austin will email the website for the pattern for 4x7 port pillows and both items will be added to the new member package guide. Connie reported that Sonja Simmons is keeping busy making Hospice and VJ quilts.

Activities: Gail Toliver reminded members participating that the Challenge is due at the August

13<sup>th</sup> meeting. Size is minimum 24x24 up to 48x48 total perimeter. Bring a patriotic fat quarter to be donated to Quilts of Valor and wear something patriotic to the July meeting for stamps. A school supply collection will be held in August. Martha Austin and Trudy Pollard won the quilt acronym game.

Stephanie Mayes announced the quilt show has 4 vendors using 9 spaces and asked members to contact Martha Austin if they have a potential vendor. Quilt entry forms will be due at the August meeting. Barbara Bruce will bring forms and they will be available on the website and Facebook. Alice Springs is collecting donations of new items for fund raising baskets. Stephanie asked Mildred Lamb for permission to use a plaque she was presented as the logo for the quilt show. The 2018 quilt show theme is Then & Now. Mildred will be a VIP for the guild's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2019.



Melba drew Mona Burtz for the Raleigh Expo tickets and Sandra Allred won the embroidery patterns. Members presented Show & Tell items. The meeting adjourned at 8:22 pm.

Two color Pineapple Block. It is NOT foundation pieced. Anita uses an Innovative technique that has no waste. There is minimal preparation for the class. We will cut and sew at least 1 block, if not two. We will learn the shortcuts. And no waste! Her book Rotary Cutting Revolution is required. It is available as an ebook from Amazon. 
