Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday Jan. 14, 2018

President Barbara Hinson began the meeting at 6:30. Karen Swart made a motion to pass the December minutes, Carol Eicher second the motion. Natalie Swilley said we have sixty-three paid members and reminded that the dues are thirty-five dollars. We have one new member Elaine Brower and Chris Egan was a visitor. Karen Swart announced the January birthdays. Prudence Robinson, Alice Springs and Marguerite Klaiber won the birthday balloons. Starting this month there is a list for the birthday members on what to do for helping set up and clean up. Each member will be responsible once a year for helping out. Barbara Hinson asked for members to sign up to be greeters. Melba Mick would like two people a month.

There will be a group committee meeting on February 4th at Johnnies Farm House at noon. The restaurant is located on Copperfield Rd.

Everyone went over the 2019 budget, it is the same as last year. In January we started out with \$22,411.00 and December we ended up with \$17,133.91. Melba Mick made a motion that we pass the budget and Janie MacGown second the motion. There needs to be two people to count the money that is turned in. If it is over \$100 please say

where it goes, what it is for, and who turned it in. Members want the budget to be on a computer in Quicken. Julie Love will set that up. The audit team only did two months.

Karen Knapp had everyone shop with their stamps. The names of the people who donated items for the shop were put into a drawing and Denice Rehlander won.

The February project is to make a magnet with red on it and something showing forty years of the guild.

Julie Love spoke about the quilt show. It will be on October 18th and 19th. at the City Club under the Depot. Quilts are to be turned in on October 11th and judging will be on the 12th. The name of the show is Splash of Color 40 Years and Still Going. Julie has four or five venders lined up. Her committee met and are going over the entry form. She needs help printing cards that are needed by the end of January. She also needs someone to serve refreshments and someone to work at the front door. Terry Patterson will do the post cards.

Anita Black is resigning the chairmanship of the 2019 raffle quilt because of health reasons. The quilt is already at Dawn Hopkins to be quilted. SUGGESTED REFRESHMENT PROVIDERS LIST FOR SET UP AND CLEAN UP FOR MEETINGS

BEFORE MEETING:

- 1. Bring out Supplies from Supply Room.
- 2. Set up refreshment table (if on blocks remove them) & put on tablecloth.
- 3. Put out plates, napkins & silverware. If needed add serving utensils to refreshments that might need them.
- 4. Heat water on stove to put into containers for tea & hot chocolate.
- 5. Make coffee.
- 6. Set up coffee/tea table with tablecloth, sugar, cups, tea, etc.
- 7. Set up counter with pot of ice (from ice machine in Supply Room) and put ice scoop in. Fill cups with ice. Put out additional cups for any beverages that have been brought in.
- 8. Arrange refreshments that have been brought in.

AFTER MEETING:

- 1. Put all Supplies back into containers and take back to Supply Room.
- 2. Wash out coffee pot & tea pots. Take back to Supply Room.
- 3. Clean all utensils that were used and put back where found.
- 4. Wipe down sink that was used.
- 5. Clear & wipe tables and counters used.
- 6. Put table back on blocks if you used that table.
- 7. Empty all trash bags into "ONE" bag and take out to trash receptacle in parking lot outside.




