Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday Feb 11, 2018

President Barbara Hinson began the meeting at 6:30. She thanked everyone for coming. Denise Rehlander made a motion to pass the January minutes and Melba Mick second it. There were four visitors, Becky Bernhardt, Jim Lemons, Carol Harris and Sandy Zad. There are three new members, Cathy Moore, Beth Huneycutt, and Ann Weaver. Karen Swart named off the February birthdays. Julie Love, Peggy Overcash, and Sandy Winter's names were drawn for the balloons. Debbie Morse reminded everyone to be sure to pick up their raffle tickets. The show date and when the drawing will be held are on the tickets. Darlene Woodhem said Mathew Emmerson will be coming to the guild meeting and talk about Color Theory for Quilters. Only three people have signed up for

the Saturday class if no one else signs up that class will be canceled.

Mattie Johnson did a trunk show. The quilts were beautiful, and the backs were just as beautiful, she makes them reversable. She tries to sew every day and sometimes into the night. She has made over three hundred quilts since she started quilting in 2004.

Connie Richardson said this Friday is charity quilting at the Fire Station. She would like everyone to work on stuffing the bears. Connie has some kits for the bears if you would like to make one. There is a need for more hospice quilts. The guild supplies the batting for the hospice and Victory Junction quilts. Valerie McGarity and Karen Knapp said there were 22 magnets made. February the guild is to make fidget quilts. They are to be about twenty-four inches and have buttons, zippers, beads, ribbon on them but must be very securely sewn on. There can be ribbon sewed on the edge so it can be attached to a wheel chair, but not too short as to look like the person is tied in. They will be due in April.

Julie Love said there were nineteen people on the quilt show committee. There are nine vendors signed up for the show. Julie will be sending an email to Janneke Bahamon that will be sent out to all members on the rules for the quilts to be entered into the show. Lisa Alley is going to be one of the judges, they are still looking for a second judge. Martha Austin did the drawing for the sewing machine. Debbie Morse won the machine. Martha is going to donate the money to the outreach program

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50.

SUGGESTED REFRESHMENT PROVIDERS LIST FOR SET UP AND CLEAN UP FOR MEETINGS

Please arrive at 5:30 to help with set up and stay about 30 minutes after the meeting to help with clean up.

BEFORE MEETING:

- 1. Bring out Supplies from Supply Room.
- 2. Set up refreshment table (if on blocks remove them) & put on tablecloth.
- 3. Put out plates, napkins & silverware. If needed add serving utensils to refreshments that might need them.
- 4. Heat water on stove to put into containers for tea & hot chocolate.
- 5. Make coffee.
- 6. Set up coffee/tea table with tablecloth, sugar, cups, tea, etc.
- 7. Set up counter with pot of ice (from ice machine in Supply Room) and put ice scoop in. Fill cups with ice. Put out additional cups for any beverages that have been brought in.
- 8. Arrange refreshments that have been brought in.

AFTER MEETING:

- 1. Put all Supplies back into containers and take back to Supply Room.
- 2. Wash out coffee pot & tea pots. Take back to Supply Room.
- 3. Clean all utensils that were used and put back where found.
- 4. Wipe down sink that was used.
- 5. Clear & wipe tables and counters used.
- 6. Put table back on blocks if you used that table.

7. Empty all trash bags into "ONE" bag and take out to trash receptacle in parking lot outside.


