### LAST MEETING MINUTES

Cabarrus Quilters Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday, March 11, 2019

At 6:30 Darlene Woodham welcomed members and guests and announced that officers are at a retreat this week. Natalie Swilley recognized 6 visitors. Carol Harris, former member, joined the guild tonight. Natalie read March birthdays and asked anyone interested in sewing at First Wesleyan to sign up at the sheet on the front desk. Darlene told members Melba Mick will bring fat quarters next month for members with March birthdays. Darlene asked members interested in serving on the Nominating Committee or as an officer for 2020-21 to contact Barbara Hinson. She read a thank you note from CVAN for the \$500 donation received. A motion was made by Marguerite Klaiber to approve the minutes for the February meeting, seconded by Carolyn Sweet and approved by a majority vote of members.

Darlene introduced speaker Ann P. Shaw who traveled from Portland, Oregon to join us. Her lecture was on Line, Shape and Design in Quilts. Her presentation included details of her design process and she displayed some of her completed quilts. She had patterns for sale and also sells on Etsy. She suggested members attending her workshop tomorrow go through their stash tonight to bring more fabrics.

Charlotte Doyle distributed instructions for the April workshop on Seminole Piecing by Anna Lopez. Darlene announced Mattie Johnson's husband is in the hospital and member Diane Viera passed away about 2 weeks ago due to complications from surgery. After a short break, Julie told members quilt show flyers are available and if any members are going to area quilt shops to let her know. She asked if anyone had questions about the entry forms and there were none. Darlene

introduced Valerie McGarity and Karen Knapp from the Activities Committee to give details about the upcoming 40<sup>th</sup> Ruby Anniversary of the guild and the Challenge Table Toppers with red fabric due at the September meeting with forms for quilt show entry due at the August meeting. Ona Phillips showed the 2019 QOV block and asked members to download the instructions at QOVF.org. She suggested using a scant 1/4" on seams to make the 12" finished block. She will collect blocks at future meetings. Connie Richardson reminded members the Charity Sew Date at the Poplar Tent Fire Station is Friday, March 15th. Most bears are stuffed and now need to be sewn closed so no sewing machines are needed. Any charity projects can be worked on. Connie also reported that Sonja Simmons has been making tops for Hospice for 3 years now and recently thanked Tom for quilting her donations. Connie Vause reported Dawn Hopkins had surgery about 2 weeks ago to add a stent and wanted to be sure she was recognized for the quilting done on the raffle quilt. Darlene announced Anna Lopez will present on March 24th from 2:30-3:30 at the Eastern Cabarrus Museum in Mt Pleasant and asked members to attend. Debbie Morse asked members to pick up raffle quilt tickets and Carol Eicher suggested members put pictures on their personal Facebook pages to sell tickets. Darlene said no sewing machines are needed per Ann for the workshop tomorrow at Rocky River Presbyterian Church. Members presented Show & Tell items.

The meeting adjourned at 8:35 pm.

# SUGGESTED REFRESHMENT PROVIDERS LIST FOR SET UP AND CLEAN UP FOR MEETINGS

Please arrive at 5:30 to help with set up and stay about 30 minutes after the meeting to help with clean up.

#### **BEFORE MEETING:**

- 1. Bring out Supplies from Supply Room.
- 2. Set up refreshment table (if on blocks remove them) & put on tablecloth.
- 3. Put out plates, napkins & silverware. If needed add serving utensils to refreshments that might need them.
- 4. Heat water on stove to put into containers for tea & hot chocolate.
- 5. Make coffee.
- 6. Set up coffee/tea table with tablecloth, sugar, cups, tea, etc.
- 7. Set up counter with pot of ice (from ice machine in Supply Room) and put ice scoop in. Fill cups with ice. Put out additional cups for any beverages that have been brought in.
- 8. Arrange refreshments that have been brought in.

#### **AFTER MEETING:**

- 1. Put all Supplies back into containers and take back to Supply Room.
- 2. Wash out coffee pot & tea pots. Take back to Supply Room.
- 3. Clean all utensils that were used and put back where found.
- 4. Wipe down sink that was used.
- 5. Clear & wipe tables and counters used.
- 6. Put table back on blocks if you used that table.
- 7. Empty all trash bags into "ONE" bag and take out to trash receptacle in parking lot outside.

# RULES FOR CABARRUS QUILTERS GUILD 2019 OUILT CHALLENGE

- 1. Item must be a TABLE TOPPER (any size)
- 2. Item must have 3 LAYERS to be quilted, tie, or fastened together
- 3. Must have some VISIBLE RED
- 4. Must have a LABEL with maker's name and date completed on back of quilt
- 5. Quilt label location- Looking at the BACK of the quilt, with the top of the quilt at the north position, the LOWER LEFT HAND corner is where you will place the label. If you are looking at the front of the quilt, if you lift the bottom right corner, you will see the label.
- 6. Quilts are due at September meeting (Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>). Must be in an opaque bag to prevent other guild members from identifying the maker of a quilt during the turn in process.
- 7. All rules must be followed for entry into the September vote for favorite table topper.
