The kit fee for this workshop will cover all materials needed to complete the quilt project and the nice quilt stand to display the quilt. You will be learning appliqué techniques, bias tubing for the vine trellis and a new binding technique. This quilt is made as three panels, so the binding technique is very different, as you do not bind the center panel quilt on two of the sides. Cutoff date for signing up on this workshop will be the May 10th meeting so we can give Cathy plenty of time to work with everyone regarding the selection of photos.

Cathy is a wonderful quilt artist. She will be taking you through the process of creating a quilt from a photo of your choice. We will be working on making our own pattern, and then we will start the process of creating the quilt. The kit fee includes materials that Cathy recommends for your individual quilt.

Because the business portions of our meeting took so much time, the Challenge quilt, Mystery Quilt, Block of the Month, and Show-and-Tell did not take place.

Stephanie reminded members that Pat Nagle will be presenting her program at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 6. A voluntary donation of \$1 has been requested.


