- Vendors will be permitted into the building at 10 AM to begin their set up.
- Our goal is to have all the quilts hung by 2 PM and we will then have a *sneak preview for members* only from 3 PM to 4:45 PM. *Many of our vendors will be open* as well, and you will have a chance to view all the quilts and do some shopping if you like.
- **5 PM to 6 PM** We will announce the Ribbon Winner's and you will be permitted to hang your ribbon on your quilt. (Not to worry, someone will hang your ribbon for you if you are not present).
- Doors close at 6 PM.

So far I only have 2 people signed up for the Susan Edmonson Workshop – Home Tweet Home on Sept 18<sup>th</sup>. In Susan's Workshop you will learn Appliqué techniques, embellishing with felted wool, 3 dimensional embellishments, rubber-stamping and inking fabrics. Photo transfers and miscellaneous trims will be used.

When taking a workshop it is a good idea to come with the frame of mind you are learning a new technique. Although you may come home with a project that is finished, or one that is on its way to be finished, you may also find that you want to start the project over. That is fine, now you have the knowledge you gained from the workshop, and in the freedom of your own surroundings you can now complete the project in any way you wish! Many of these workshops are designed to give you the knowledge to not only to finish the pattern from this designer, but also to give you the skills to apply this new technique to future projects in your quilting life.

It is time to start signing up for the Linda Cantrell workshop in October. # Recipe from the Covered Dish Picnic:

Below is a recipe from **Amber Lyons**. She brought this to the August Potluck Picnic. It was delicious and was gone quickly!! Amber was kind enough to share the recipe.

"Trailer Park Surprise" or "Pine Bark"

One sleeve of Saltines One cup of Butter One cup of Brown Sugar 1 tsp. of Vanilla
½ cup of Chopped peanuts
5 Hershey Bars

Lay saltines face down on a foil lined cookie sheet. Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Bring Butter and Sugar to a boil and boil for 6 to 7 minutes. Remove from heat and add vanilla. Pour over saltines and bake 7 minutes. After removing from the oven immediately place Hershey bars over saltines and spread with back of a spoon to cover. Sprinkle chopped peanuts on top. Transfer to wax paper lined cookie sheet and let cool in fridge.
