Minutes of General Membership Meeting March 9, 2015

The meeting was held in the fellowship hall next door, due to a funeral dinner/gathering in the regular meeting place.

President Carolyn Sweet opened the meeting at 6:45 by welcoming visitors and new members.
Greeters were JoAnna Cupp, Marguerite Klaiber and Adrienne Phalen. Refreshments were provided

by Ann Ashworth, Debbie Morse, Sylvia Stancil, Melba Mick and Bonnie Labadie.

Carolyn read a thank you note from CVAN for our gift of \$600 from last year's raffle quilt. She also read a thank you letter from the family of a Hospice quilt recipient.

Carolyn reminded everyone to sign up at the library table if they completed something from the February M&M. She also advised the membership that our facility's fee has gone from \$300 annually to \$40 per month. We are not looking for optional meeting places, as this is a very good rate. She also reminded members that the board members do set up and take down each month—restoring the room to its original position. The room must be left in the condition we found it in or there is an additional charge. Reminder to all members to pick up after themselves—throw away trash, clean up spills, and return chairs and tables to their original positions.

Candy McManaway introduced Susan Brubaker Knapp from Mooresville who shared slides of some of her quilts and talked about her inspirations. Candy outlined the upcoming meetings: There will be a workshop on Tuesday by Renee Hoagland who will be teaching embellishments. April will be the Pizza Girls with the "Fifteen Degrees" quilt workshop. Workshop is \$30/kit \$20. May's speaker will be Jane Hall with a workshop on Strips on Foundation.

Nancy Miller gave a report on the retreat scheduled June 12-14 on Seabrook Island, SC at the St. Christopher Conference Center. We have had a couple people drop out. Contact her to be on the waiting list (only one person currently). Last payment is due March 15th. Also, if someone has

to cancel, Nancy will put them in touch with someone from the waiting list. If that person wants to go to retreat, they will reimburse the dropping member directly to avoid going through the Treasury. Next month, Nancy will have something for all retreaters. A 10 minute break was taken.

Debbie Robb spoke about the bed turning at Quilt show—this will be the last year she does it. If you have quilts that you might want to share, contact Debbie. Joanna Cupp gave the quilt show report. We only have a couple of vendors so far. Please start bringing White Elephant items in May—fabric sells especially well, so clean out your stash. Also, Marcel Miller sent a letter to Joanna asking for members to submit quilts to the NQA show by the deadline April 1st.

Activities: Participants "went fishing" and fished out a playing card. They are to use it—anything on it—for inspiration. They can use number, color, shape, topics, etc. They are to bring something back next month. No rules. Need not be finished. Debbie and Candy wore Chinese lanterns on their head, held a stuffed goat doll, and said that next month they would unveil the annual guild challenge.

Carolyn recognized members with March birthdays. Eight members participated in show and tell with various projects for the members to enjoy viewing.

QUILTS OF VALOR PROJECT

A group of nine guild members have signed up to work on tops for the national Quilts of Valor Foundation. At the present time there is a backlog of approximately 189 requests in the State of North Carolina that still needs to be filled. Our group is attempting to accumulate 21 of these quilts for the recipients located in several counties around us and will be presenting them when we have enough quilts made. We are making some progress but are in need of some assistance.

If you are interested in participating in this worthwhile endeavor, there are several ways you can help. A list of QOVF basic requirements for

quilts is attached to this newsletter or go to www.qovf.org for further information:

- 1. Quilt tops made with <u>pre-washed</u> 100% cotton fabric in patriotic colors (minimum size is 55x65 and maximum size is 72x90).
- 2. 12-1/2 inch blocks made with <u>pre-washed</u> 100% cotton fabrics in patriotic colors that our group can assemble into quilt tops. These could be strip-pieced on muslin foundation, log cabin squares, 4 square blocks, 9 square blocks, half-square triangle blocks or star blocks.
- 3. Long-arm quilting If you are willing to do the long-arm quilting, the batting and backing will be supplied for these quilts.

Please contact Barbara Orr if you are interested in being part of the group or if you are able to assist us in any way to meet our goal.

Sew What's for Dinner?



Tomato-Potato-Zucchini-Summer Squash "Casserole"

Ingredients

- 1 TABLESPOON OF OLIVE OIL
- 1 MEDIUM ONION
- 2 CLOVES OF GARLIC
- 1 MEDIUM ZUCCHINI
- 1 MEDIUM SUMMER (YELLOW) SQUASH
- 1 LARGE POTATO
- 1 LARGE TOMATO
- 1 TEASPOON DRIED TYME
- 1 TEASPOON FRESH ROSEMARY (CHOPPED)

SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE

1 CUP SHREDDED ITALIAN CHEESE

STEP 1: Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Finely dice the onion and mince the garlic. Sauté onions in a skillet with olive oil until softened (roughly 5 minutes) then add the garlic until fragrant (about 1-2 minutes).

STEP 2: While the onion and garlic are sautéing, thinly slice the rest of the vegetables. Slice them into the same shape. I used a mandolin but you could also use a food processor or by hand as well (just try to get them to be as close to the same thickness as possible)

STEP 3: Spray the inside of an 8×8 square or round baking dish with non-stick spray. Spread the softened onion and garlic in the bottom of the dish. Place the thinly sliced vegetables in the baking dish vertically, in an alternating pattern. Sprinkle generously with salt, pepper, thyme, and rosemary.

STEP 4: Cover the dish with foil and bake for 30 minutes. Remove the foil, top with cheese and bake for another 15-20 minutes or until the cheese is golden brown.

Spring has sprung, clean your studio!



Spring is a great time to clean the cobwebs out of your quilting studio!

Start with your fabric collection. It doesn't take long to discover yards of fabric that you no longer like, and wonder what motivated you to buy it in the first place. Take this opportunity to part with some stash and put it to good use. Donate it to your local guild's charity program for Quilts of Valor, Freedom Quilts, Ronald McDonald House, etc.

Go through that gadget pile. Haven't used it in the past two years? Host a "trading post" or white elephant exchange at your next guild meeting. Put a garage-sale price on the gadget and donate it to the guild. Money earned goes to the guild's treasury for quilt education.

Sort through your thread collection. If you haven't stored it in airtight containers away from light, and it is cotton, it may have become brittle. If you inherited it from Grandma, it's probably best to display it in a pretty jar on your shelf instead of struggling to use it. Trade or sell spools that are simply taking up space.

Depart with your unfinished projects. If you're a multi-crafter, decide whether you will ever pick up that unfinished needlework sampler and finish it, or if it's time to part with it now. We often hold on to our "someday" projects because we feel too guilty we never completed them. Shut your eyes, put it in a box or the trash and move on. Something caused you to lose interest in the first place, whether that was desire, time or even dislike. Why spend valuable "today" time on something you weren't motivated to finish way back then?
