July 2014 - Minutes

The meeting began at 6:45 p.m.

The social period was open from 6:15 to 6:45 during which refreshments were served, visitors greeted, sign ups (workshops, greeters, refreshments) occurred and members paid dues. Refreshments were provided by: Ann Ashworth and Debbie Morse. Sue Mosier was greeter. President Carolyn Sweet opened the meeting by welcoming visitors and new members.

Carolyn began by addressing an omission that was made in the June meeting's minutes. The lifetime membership award to Phyllis Grass was omitted from the meeting minutes. A motion was made and passed to amend the June minutes.

Pat Arndt welcomed speaker Mickey Depre, who shared the story of her life and how she became a quilt teacher and the different types of quilts she has made in her life. She shared a slideshow and stories about her quilts. Pat gave a brief run-down of August, September, and October's programs. August will be the picnic and guild challenge, September is a wonky log cabin. October is the quilt show and Sharon Cole, with easy needle-turn applique. More sign-ups are needed for September and October. Reminder to pay the meeting the month before the program.

Candy McManaway discussed activities. She invited members to show the blocks they have been working on for block of the month. Nancy Miller advised that everyone should have Clue 5. Clue 6 is the final clue and will be sent to all participants before next meeting. A reminder was given that August meeting is our magazine challenge and that you must attach your magazine cover to your entry. The guild stamp must be clearly visible on your magazine cover.

Nancy took deposits for the retreat at St. Christopher's Camp and Conference Center on Seabrook Island, SC on June 12-14. Cost is \$200 per person. A \$70 deposit was due at the July meeting. We will be limiting to 18 participants but will have a waiting list in case we have anyone cancel. Final payments will be \$70 by Nov. 15 and \$60 by March 15 16 members showed quilts and projects they had completed. Several quilts and projects were shown.

Quilt Show: Joanna Cupp discussed the need for 2 carts to carry the bases for quilt show setup. We currently have \$500 set aside for that expense, which will be approximately \$750-\$1000. A motion was made by Tom Richardson and second by Charlotte Doyle to provide funds for this expense. The motion passed. Joanna reminded everyone the entry form for the quilt show is on the Web site and entries are due in August. Quilts will need to be turned in September 2. Hard copies of the entry form and rules were available at the meeting She also has tickets for a sewing machine that members can sell. This helps fund quilt show prizes. Silent auction committee is looking for projects to be made/finished for silent auction. White elephant is looking for items for the White Elephant Booth and received some small quilts and

a couple of bags. A large quilt or two would be very helpful

July birthdays were recognized with a fat quarter for the members present.

Announcements: We need refreshments for November meeting. Debbie Morse gave information about an ongoing shop hop and invited interested members to contact her. Ona Phillips collected blocks for QOV. Sew Saturday will be working a bag taught by Barb Bruce—your fabric will need to be prequilted.

The door prize was drawn. A reminder that the next meeting is August 11.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:49p.m.

Sew What's Cooking?



Zucchini Marinara Bake (pictured before baking)

A serving of this with a side of chicken or fish makes a fantastic dinner.

Recipe Ingredients: 1-1/2 to 2 pounds zucchini, cut in strips or diced

2 oz. pasta of choice, cooked according to package directions

2 1/2 ox. mozzarella cheese, shredded or cut in small slices

2 tomatoes, diced

About 6 oz. 'baby bello' mushrooms, sliced

1 1/2 cups low-fat marinara sauce (60 calories per 1/2 cup, Trader Joe's is a favorite)

2 tsp olive oil

Spray 8X8 pan w/Pam or other veg. spray. Layer all ingredients twice, and put extra squash, mushrooms tomatoes and sauce on top. Bake at 400 degrees for 30 minutes.


Newsletter Information:
