### Sewing Tips and Tricks

#### More Tips for Finding Inspiration

**Carry a camera or sketchbook.** Record patterns made by bricks, windows, trellises, and grids; flower petals, vines, and tree branches; collections and assortments of objects.

**Pin It!** Use Pinterest to keep track of quilt blocks and patterns you like. Lots of quilters and sewing enthusiasts pin ideas, quilts, quilt patterns, and images that can help spark ideas

**Visit a quilt show, museum, or gallery.** Just looking at other works of art—even if they're not out of fabric—can give you many ideas for quilt designs and color combinations.

**Sort your stash.** Sometimes, an hour of folding and organizing fabric can replenish the creative well. You might see a fabric combination you like or maybe the process will relax your mind and some new idea will just pop in.

**Look at blocks.** One block can lead to another, so flip through your quilting magazines and go online to your favorite quilting website for inspiration.

**Sew What's for Dinner?**



**Stuffed Meatloaf Roll**

- 2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1 cup dry bread crumbs
- 2 eggs beaten
- 1 chopped onion
- 1 chopped bell pepper
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1 cup chopped black olives
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon leaf oregano
- 1 8 oz can tomato sauce
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 cans crescent rolls

In large bowl, combine beef, crumbs, egg, onion, salt and oregano. Stir in 1/2 tomato sauce; set aside. Cut 2 pieces of waxed paper 15 inches long. Unroll crescent roll dough and don't separate. Lay end to end on top of wax paper and place second piece of wax paper on top. Now take rolling pin and roll the dough out till it's half the thickness that it was originally. Remove top piece of waxed paper. Place meat mixture in center and spread out over dough. Sprinkle meat with cheese, bell pepper, mushrooms and olives; top with remaining tomato sauce. Roll up meat, jelly-roll fashion, starting at narrow end; use wax paper to help. Place seam side down in non-stick 9-1/4-in. x 5-1/2 in. x 2-3/4-in. bread pan. Bake at 375 degrees F for 30 minutes. Drain off any fat that accumulates; return to oven for 30 minutes.

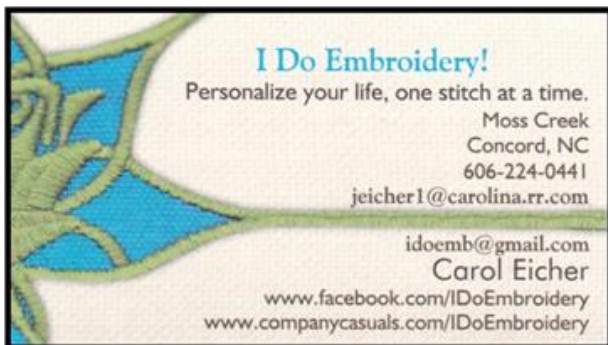
