How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the CQG?

I've been a member for about 15 years. I took a beginners quilt class from Peggy Fox, a long-time member. At the time I took the class, she encouraged me to join.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting?

I've been a member for about 15 years. During my lunchbreak at work, a friend, Linda, and I were teaching another friend to cross-stitch. Linda suggested I'd be a great quilter. I'd never thought about adopting the hobby before that. She suggested I take a beginners class. Although she was a longtime quilter, she said she'd take the class with me. We signed up for a beginners quilt class instructed by Peggy Fox. Interesting to note here, Linda lived off of South Blvd in Charlotte. We worked in an office in the South Park area of Charlotte. We'd leave work at 5:00 p.m., travel to the classroom in Concord for the 7:00 to 9:00 class, and Linda would travel back home to South Blvd, Charlotte. We continued taking another, then another, class for about two years. It was an outstanding sacrifice Linda made. God rest her soul.

Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

My Mother was a great inspiration for all types of handwork. Mother was self taught.

Piece work is my favorite part.


AUGUST PICNIC

- July Pinwheel / Applique or Paper Piecing



Guild Challenge






