Last Meeting Minutes

Monday, November 14, 2022

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President, Jackie Sabo at 6:35 PM.

Welcome Committee chair, Valerie McGarity, announced we had no visitors this month.

PROGRAM: Caroline Mason from Hospice came to thank our members for our quilt donations. Each patient receives a quilt when they enter Hospice. She told us the patients and families greatly appreciate our donations. Members shared the quilts we had for Hospice and Caroline took them with her.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Guild Secretary, Sandra Allred, reported 3 corrections needed in last month's minutes:

- 1. In approval of minutes Lisa Edward's last name was omitted.
- 2. In the report from the Holiday Party committee, "Table Caption" was changed to "Table Captain"
- 3. And Table Captains Linda Leona and *Phyllis Grass* should be Linda Leona and *Phyllis Moysan*.

Evelyn Dugan moved to approve the minutes with the corrections mentioned above. Alice Witek seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

OFFICER AND COMMITTEE REPORTS: President Jackie Sabo announced we had Dee's we're Sew Creative's side walk sale items at our meeting for members to purchase. Some are priced, but if you think it's too much we can make an offer to WSC. If there isn't a price, just pay what you think its worth. We are splitting the money with WSC. Lots of little things that make good Christmas presents were available. Members enjoyed shopping the yard sale.

Quilt Show – Jackie thanked members for all the help with our 2022 quilt show!

Vice President JoAnn Hahn announced a Christmas tree kit with ruler as the prize for this evening's raffle. She reminded members with November Birthdays to pick up a fat quarter.

Treasurer Johanna Hysell reminded committees to turn in their budget requests. If a request is not turned in, the 2022 budget will be used for 2023. 2022 budgets will be mailed to the chair of each committee. She apologized for not having a report on the Quilt Show financials. It will be ready for the December meeting.

Membership chair, Ann Weaver, shared we have a total of 52 members present, 51 in person and 1 on zoom.

Raffle Quilt 2022 chair, Ann Weaver, asked members to turn in their raffle ticket money ASAP. She announced we sold \$345.00 at the Quilt Show and only \$73.00 at the Pineapple Fabrics Warehouse Sale on November 3. Our next opportunity to sell tickets is Nov. 26 at the Holiday Festival at the Cabarrus Brewery. Members are needed to sell at this event. The drawing for the 2022 raffle quilt will be held at our December Holiday Party. The quilt for 2023 will also be revealed. Our first opportunity to sell tickets for the 2023 raffle quilt is December 31 at Dee's We're Sew Creative's last bag day.

Quilt Show Winners: Stephanie Newbrough, with help from Janneke Bahamon, presented members with ribbons from the viewer's choice voting at the 2022 quilt show. Winner names are in a separate document stored with these minutes on the guild's google drive and will also be included in our December Newsletter.

Programs (Karen Bronkhorst and Mary Ward) shared that Cooperative Christian Ministries was at our meeting to collect food or financial donations. If anyone missed making their donations, JoAnn Hahn will take them.

Tomorrow's workshop is on wreath making. It will be at Rocky River Presbyterian church. Karen and JoAnn will be available to help members who attend.

There will not be a program or workshop in December. We will have our Holiday Party. Open sew is available at First Wesleyan instead of a workshop.

There will not be a program in January. We will have our annual business meeting instead. 2023 programs will also be announced at January's meeting

Activities – Members shared their finished quilts or quilt tops made from our Round Robin activity. Jackie announced our Activities chair has started a new job and needs to resign. She asked for a volunteer. Julie Love and Darlene Woodham volunteered to serve as our 2023 activities co-chairs.

Community Outreach (Tom and Connie Richardson and Carol Harris):

- Connie announced we have completed over 200 quilts for charity this year. She asked for members to be thinking about which charities we want to support next year. CCM has recommended we donate to Elder Orphan Care in 2023. They are a sub-organization of CCM.
- Terry Patterson took pictures of the charity quilts not yet donated before the meeting. These quilts were available for members to look over during the break.
- Connie also brought I Spy block kits for members to purchase for \$10.00 a kit for personal use. This money will go to the guild. An example was available to view and kits were also available for members to take to make a charity quilt.
- Connie reminded members we can meet at Fire Station #9 on the 2nd Friday of each month to work on charity projects.
- Connie, Carol Harris, Marta Lukac, Charlotte Doyle, and Terry Patterson shared quilts that use 5" squares and 2 ½" strips and are made from simple patterns. This shows how to use scraps for charity quilt making. The examples were available to view during break. There were some kits for people to take if they wish to use them for charity quilts.

Holiday Party Committee, Melba Mick and Carol Harris, presented Table Captains with a small gift and \$5.00 to use for their table decorations. Melba will be sending an email to the captains explaining what will be provided by the committee and what the captains need to provide for their tables. Two set up times are available for the table captains the day of the party.

BREAK: Purchase raffle tickets and birthday fat quarters.

RAFFLE DRAWING: Alice Witek won the Christmas tree quilt kit with ruler.

SHOW AND TELL of member's latest projects was held.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:58 PM.

QUILTING WITH RULERS ON YOUR DOMESTIC MACHINE SUPPLY LIST

This class is designed to take your free motion quilting to the next level.

Using a starter set of rulers we will begin by doing simple straight lines, circles, and arcs to get you comfortable moving the ruler and fabric. From there you can jump right into producing some amazing designs. If you struggle with free motion quilting, you will like this better!


Basic free motion experience needed.

I will be happy to answer all your questions and help guide you to purchase the correct foot and templates.

Ruler foot

Purchase a ruler foot that works with your machine. If your machine brand does not make a ruler foot you can purchase the generic foot from Sew Steady, please give your machine make, and model number with your order. This can be ordered from the shop, and you will get the class discount.

Quilting templates come in different thicknesses based on whether your machine is Short Shank, High Shank, or Long Arm.



Note: Bernina machines owners using the No. 72 Foot can order Long Arm thickness for templates. These can then be used on your domestic, sit-down, and long-arm machine.

Quilting Templates:

- For this class we will be using the Westalee
 Design Sampler Template Set 1 (set of 6) plus,
 the Westalee Design 12" arc from Sew Steady.
- Cost of both is \$85.00 minus 15% class discount when ordered from Carol Mallozzi. Order form will be available at the December meeting. Orders need at least a 4-week lead time. This is to allow time for templates to be ordered.

Basic Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order with a flat base that extends at least four inches behind and in front of your needle.
- Extension cord
- Machine needles size 10, 12, and 14 (topstitch, sharps, embroidery)
- 6 X 24" ruler

Optional but particularly useful:

- Slider sheet
- Machine quilting gloves

Material:

- 12 to 14 quilt sandwiches 12" X 12" with batting and backing.
- Please use a light colored solid. No puffy poly batting. No need to baste these as they will be small enough to handle.
- Good quality thread that works well with your machine when you do free motion quilting. Contrast the color to your quilt sandwiches.
- Marking pen of your choice. Since these are practice pieces Frixion pens are ok but bring others as well.

HOMEWORK

On 10 of the squares, mark out a 6" square. On 2 of the squares, mark out a 4" square.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

For 2022 as of this month, we have sent out 212 quilts to various local charities. What an accomplishment for the guild thanks to all of you who contributed in many ways. I wish to thank Tom for quilting many of the quilts and Carol Harris who helped me organize and research various organizations. The breakdown for 2022 contributions were CCM received 71 of the quilts, Hospice 50, CVAN 66, Foster Children 15 and 10 to Victory Junction held from last year. I know you really wanted to support the foster program, but I just couldn't get them to respond. Carol and I are looking into other avenues to support foster children in 2023. We have approximately 10 other quilts out, either finishing the binding or were personally asked to be held for Victory Junction. We are looking at different organizations to support in 2023 and would like suggestions from you. We will compile a list, report our findings so far and complete the list for voting in our January meeting. It is not too soon to be thinking about this. You can email Carol Harris with your ideas. Thank you again for a very successful outreach program in 2022.


