Even though we do these projects to help others, we also feel satisfaction and love in our own heart. Some of the projects are making CVAN quilts for youngsters

who come into the CVAN program for various reasons, a shelter for moms and their children. We also support Quilts of Valor, Hospice, and Victory Junction. Can you feel the warmth your quilt gives to a young child facing a new place, often scared of the unknown? Can you picture him or her wrapped in your love? What about the soldier that is facing a new life back home often with insecurity? That quilt can give comfort much in the same way as one given to a child. For one who has entered *Hospice*, that quilt can be a cocoon, a place for one to take comfort in knowing that someone cared and wanted to help. The bears for Victory Junction have a special place in a child's away from home experience. The bears help them face the pleasant and the unpleasant, the unpleasant being chemotherapy treatment, shots, dialysis, or helping them go to sleep at night. There are many ways we can help all of these organizations, even if you don't want to make a quilt or a bear. *Quilts of Valor* volunteers need red, white and blue material, or any patriotic prints. You can also just make the quilt tops. Batting and quilting are available. Just see Ona Phillips. This service is also available in making Hospice quilts. See Carol Graham for details. Tom and I like to be able to donate 100 bears to Victory Junction before camp starts in May and June. There are many ways to help here. We can always use donated children's prints or bright color cotton materials. We have kits made up ready to stitch with directions, or if you want to use your own material, we will give you the black and white fabric to make the arms and legs. We will set a date later to stuff and close the bears, if you don't want to sew them. We already have enough stuffing for the year. There are many ways to show love. February is a good month to start these projects. May the cold days in February warm your hearts with love.

SEE BUDGET AS AN ATTACHED PAGE

President Connie Richardson welcomed everyone to the January meeting at 6:45pm. Six visitors were introduced and Connie checked to be sure they all had a complimentary door prize ticket. Birthdays were announced and C.C. gave fat quarters to those present. Connie reminded everyone that 2016 dues of \$30 are due and can be paid to Linda Brimanson, Membership Chair. Connie She asked members to sign up for Greeters and Refreshments for future months.

Connie told members the December minutes were printed in the newsletter. Some members indicated they did not receive the newsletter. Debbie Morse noted names and will forward the newsletter. Mildred Lamb made a motion to approve, Carolyn Sweet seconded and after a vote, the minutes were approved.

Announcements: 1) Debbie received a Thank You letter from Hospice for 13 quilts donated for Hospice patients. Carol Graham, Community Outreach Chair, was able to present a quilt to Phyllis Grass and her husband, James, on Wednesday, before he passed away. 2) Rosey Stein announced she will now provide nametags for new members and asked members that have not received a name tag to contact her. 3) Connie asked members to keep Phyllis and her family in our prayers. 4) She also announced that Sonja Simmons has been diagnosed with lung cancer and has resigned the Newsletter position. Sonja offered to prepare the February newsletter and Connie told her Tom will prepare February and asked for a volunteer to take over after February. Sonja has many tests in her future and we were asked to keep her in our prayers.

Connie asked the board members to come forward, along with the "old" board. Current board members then presented their predecessors with a gift card and Connie thanked them for their help during the transition. A gift card was then presented to Jo Anna Cupp for her efforts on the past three quilt shows. Connie also presented a Signature Quilt

from Carol Harris, prior outgoing President, to Carolyn Sweet.

Colleen began the Budget presentation by showing the guild purpose and how we meet that purpose. She displayed a summary of 2015 results showing profit of \$ 2,472.13. The Ticket Out the Door after the quilt show included positives and suggestions for Improvement that has been passed on to Melba Mick for future show. She then presented the 2016 Proposed Budget, with an estimated shortfall of \$4,285 and indicated the board is dedicated to reduce this shortfall. She asked anyone with suggestions to email her at colleen.sain63@gmail.com. All suggestions are welcome.

Connie told members the budget will be included in the newsletter and asked if there were any questions. She asked that anyone with newsletter information use her email – clrich39@gmail.com and not Tom's. Barb Bruce made a motion to approve the budget as shown, Carolyn Sweet seconded, and the budget was approved after a member vote.

Melba will give a Quilt Show update in February.

Pat Arndt started our program by asking former board members to tell how their quilting journey began and where they are now. Barb Bruce, Nancy Miller, Sharon Smith and Carolyn Sweet gave a trunk show with examples of earlier works and their most recent and expected future works.

Charlotte Doyle and Ona Phillips presented information for upcoming programs: Susan Edmondson will speak at our February meeting and sign-ups and payment for her workshop Tuesday, February 9th are due tonight. At least 10 must register to avoid cancelling the workshop. Ann Bolick will present a Trunk Show in March. Ann is a former guild member and has taught workshops for our guild. The March workshop will be delayed until Friday, April 1st when Karen Kay Buckley will present a hour lecture for our guild in advance of

her two day workshop at a Greensboro quilt shop. Charlotte & Ona made displays and had signup sheets ready for members and are working hard to schedule great speakers and workshops.

After a short break, Sara Bemus, Becky Knauer and Diane Thayer of the Guild Activities Committee, asked everyone to be sure to turn in a fat quarter in exchange for a guild activity pin. Those that forgot can turn in a fat quarter next month. We played "Getting to Know You" Bingo using envelopes with guild officers and committee chairs pictured and buttons, with fat quarters as prizes. Each envelope had a piece of card stock inside and members picked a bag of embellishments for our February activity –make a Valentine card.

Nancy Miller "revealed" the 2016 Raffle Quilt, Bejeweled, made with the 50 batik fat quarter s donated by guild members to help reduce cost. A picture will be posted on the website, and can be copied to your phone to show ticket purchasers. See Nancy at break or after meeting to pick up your tickets. She will advise of future opportunities to sell tickets.

Trudy Pollard won the door prize. Charlotte announced that 3 more people are needed to sign up for the February workshop. Five members had show and tell items, and quilt tops made with fabrics from white elephant fabrics were donated to make hospice quilts.

The meeting adjourned at 8:32 p.m.


