I like applique and for many years only did applique but found that I loved piecing while combining applique.


What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know?

Last Meeting Minutes

Cabarrus Quilters' Guild-Minutes of General Membership Meeting

Monday - January 11, 2021

President Sandra Allred opened the Zoom meeting at 6:36 pm.

President Announcements: Motto: "To instill in future generations the love and art of quilt making."

Sandra announced that this is our annual meeting. We plan to continue with Zoom meetings until we are able to meet in person again. The board decided to purchase a Zoom subscription from ourselves with no cost to the guild. It allows us to meet as long as we need to meet, play recordings of demos, and record the meetings so individuals can watch it a time of their choosing.

Treasurer Budget Presentation: Julie Love reviewed last year's spending and presented our 2021 budget. There was discussion about the CVAN donation. There was a proposal to make a \$250.00 donation to 2020 CVAN instead of \$500.00 by our president and treasurer. Member discussion occurred that it should still be \$500.00. It was decided the Board would review the amount in the January Board meeting and make a decision. Julie Love made a motion to approve the 2021 Budget as presented and Angie Graeber seconded. Members voted to approve the budget by responding yes. The budget was unanimously approved.

Committee Updates:

Membership dues of \$35 are due by the end of January. A new electronic directory will be published in February; we will not be taking new photos this year. Currently, 43 members have rejoined.

Raffle Quilt -

- *2020 sales – just over \$2000 has been turned.*
- *2021 Quilt – Picture is on the Guild Website and in the January Newsletter. Ann Weaver will be scheduling sales events.*
- *2022 Quilt – Ann has volunteered to chair the 2022 quilt committee and is looking for volunteers to help with it.*

CCM donation - We collected a total of 246 lbs. of food, and a whopping \$1,025 in cash and checks for CCM!

Other Donations -

- *CVAN - 82 quilts, pillow cases, and 1 receiving blanket*
- *Hospice: 81 as of November and 20 in progress*
- *Port pillows: 88*
- *Quilts of Valor: 18*
- *Victory Junction: 115 Bears and 57 quilts*

Review of Membership requirements -

Section 3: Cuddle Quilts:

Each member/junior member shall be responsible for at least, but not limited to, one cuddle quilt per year. Cuddle quilts are due at the November meeting each year and will be donated to Cabarrus Victims Assistance Network ("CVAN") in November or December of each year.

Section 4: Raffle Tickets:

Each adult member shall be responsible for selling a minimum of twenty-five (25) raffle tickets for the raffle quilt each year.

December drive by update - As mentioned in newsletter we had a great turn out and handed out all 58 gift bags.

We currently have a committee reviewing our by-laws with the intention to update them to meet the needs of an electronic world. The review was delayed by Covid but will begin soon via Zoom meetings.

Last Meeting Minutes

Donation for Charity quilts:

- Beth Huneycutt donated several bolts of fabric
- 9 partial bolts of fabric (from Elaine Voncannon) for us to use with our CVAN and Victory Junction quilts. Connie & Tom have the fabric and welcomes everyone to go to their house and cut fabric from the donations for yourself. A workshop day to sew on charity quilts will be scheduled.
- Connie and Tom have bears ready for volunteers to make, contact them for pickup. They have patterns, fabric and kits if you would like to help make bears.
- If you go to Elaine's in the near future check out the bolts in the \$3, \$2, and \$1 bins for charity quilts. Elaine is willing to donate this fabric.

Jackie Sabo did the monthly drawing and the winners were Lisa Edwards, Pat Ott, and Gaye Gordon.


PROGRAMS



2021 RAFFLE QUILT





Happy Valentines month ladies. Enjoy some chocolate and Champagne. (even if you buy it for yourself). I have found a quilters Newsfeed. It features quilters of all ages and backgrounds along with history, new techniques, new fabrics and quilting, and piecing trends. Find it at [Quilting News | AllPeopleQuilt.com](https://www.allpeoplequilt.com/quilting-news). Here is a sample of an couple of articles.

- **Quilter Creates for Children in Poverty** -Story originally published by [The Yankton Daily](#). Joyce Janssen spent a lifetime making quilts, but it wasn't until 2009 that she felt a strong pull toward community service. "I felt my mission was to make quilts for the children," Joyce told The Yankton Daily. For the last eight years, Joyce has made more than 245 quilts for children in Yankton's Head Start program, a federally-funded service that focuses on providing educational, nutritional, and family support to children in poverty and children with disabilities. With the help of her two daughters, Joyce purchased most of the fabrics for each quilt during Black Friday sales in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, each year. One quilt costs around twenty dollars to make when fabrics are purchased on sale, but the cost continues to grow because Joyce prefers to use flannels.
- **Ohio Mom Sells Quilts for Children Suffering from Cystic Fibrosis** -Story originally published by [ABC 6](#). Daniela Di Lorenzo has a talent and a cause. Her talent-quilting; her cause-cystic fibrosis awareness. Daniela has spent 10 years quilting and has never given away a quilt. Once she collected more than 100 quilts, she knew that it was time to put her creations toward something bigger. Her son Mario, who suffers from cystic fibrosis, was the inspiration for what was to come. The mom of four decided to sell each quilt for 200 dollars and then donated the proceeds to children at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Ohio who suffer with cystic fibrosis. Daniela's handmade quilts sold out quickly, and she continues to take orders for her project "Mario's Quilts. s accomplished, saying "it is so selfless."

2021 MYSTERY QUILT


Mystery Quilt Clue #2

Are you ready for clue #2? The next clue is attached, so you can print or save. I'm trying to work ahead to make sure there are no surprises but guess what? Found one! The instructions say to make half square triangles, which we know how to do, but I found my square doesn't match my half square triangle. I don't want another tool like the instructions suggest so I simply trimmed AFTER I sewed the squares together. Reading ahead this will not cause problems with the rest of the clues. Just remember to trim AFTER sewing squares together. If you have any questions or need help just let me know.

Guild Mystery Quilt Clue #2

Use a favorite technique to make half square triangles with background (light) fabric and fat eighths (dark fabrics) that will measure 2-1/2" (finish to 2" in quilt).



layer background fabric and fat eighths right side together and make:
wall hanging: 96 half square triangles that will measure 2-1/2" (finish to 2" in quilt)
lap quilt: 136 half square triangles that will measure 2-1/2" (finish to 2" in quilt)

NOTE

Remember that MOST techniques for half square triangles add 7/8" for the unfinished CUT (rather than 1/2" for plain patches). Some techniques (easy angle, etc.) allow you to make half square triangles from strips cut 1/2" larger than they will finish in the quilt (the same size as the plain patches in your quilt)

The grid technique allows you to make several (36 to 42) half square triangles from each sandwich of a fat eighth and background fabric.



Using two 2-1/2" squares (from Clue #1) and 2 half square triangles (made in this clue), assemble 48 blocks (for wall hanging, 68 for lap size) of the following four patch:
