Last Meeting Minutes

Cabarrus Quilters' Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting January 10, 2022

Welcome: President Jackie Sabo called our meeting to order at 6:31. Returning members Stephanie Newbrough, Elaine Brower and new member Stefanee Levey were welcomed. Along with first time visitors Jennifer Perkins and Ellie Bremer.

Minutes: Jackie moved to approve our December minutes and Marguerite Klaiber seconded the motion. There were no questions or comments and the minutes passed.

Membership chair Ann Weaver reminded members that dues of \$35 are due by the end of January. New members pay an extra five dollars for the making of their name tag. A new electronic directory will be published in February. Directory photos can be taken tonight and next month. See Terry Patterson to have your photo taken. We currently have 67 members.

2021 Audit of our accounts was performed in December by Melba Mick. Every transaction was reviewed and our accounts passed the audit

Sales of tickets for our **2021 Raffle quilt** resulted in \$3,027.00 in earning. It was our largest fund raiser of 2021.

Our **2022 Raffle quilt** picture is on the Guild Website and was in the January Newsletter. Members raffle tickets are available for pick up tonight. Two sales events are scheduled. Sanford Quilting Expo on Jan 14-15 and bag day at We're Sew Creative on Jan 29. Volunteers are needed for Bag Day. Sanford is mostly covered but Ann can use a few more volunteers. There is a five-dollar entrance fee for the Sanford show. The show is allowing us to have a free booth for paying the entrance fee. See Ann at the membership table to volunteer.

2023 Raffle quilt preparation is under way. A kit was purchased, and Co-chairs, Sharon Smith and Terry Patterson are looking for six experienced paper piecing members to help make the quilt.

2021 Community Outreach update:

- Port pillows: 60 These are delivered to the Levine Cancer Center.
- Quilts of Valor: 16
- Victory Junction: 101 Bears and 71 quilts

2022 Community Outreach vote: Terry Patterson passed out ballots for voting. Descriptions of each charity was published in our January Newsletter. Each member was allowed to select 3 charities to which we will donate the required membership quilts. Hospice was not on the original ballot, but could be added. The vote chose Cabarrus County Foster Care, Cooperative Christian Ministries and CVAN as our three 2022 charities. Our February newsletter will have quilt size requirement for each organization.

The guild will continue to make bears for Victory Junction.

2022 Quilt Show: Julie Love and Sandra Allred are in the process of contacting vendors from our 2019 show to see if they want to participate this year. One deposit was received from Dawn Hopkins (long arm and quilt shop owner). The Silent Auction Committee is being chaired by Jo Ann Hahn and plans are underway for it. Other

committees for the show will be formed later this year. The show will be Oct. 14 and 15, with a set up day on Oct. 13. The show will be held at the City Club.

Discussion of the cost of venues was held during the budget discussion. A suggestion was made to move the quilt show to summertime so we could make use of school gymnasiums, instead of renting a venue.

2022 Activities – Shanna Rogers, Activities chair, presented our February activity – Valentine fabric post cards. Instructions will be emailed on how to make them. Our yearlong activity will be a Round Robin Quilt. Shanna explained how this will work and answered questions. She will be emailing directions out to members.

2022 Programs – Karen Bronkhurst, Programs chair, presented plans for the year. These will be listed in the February Newsletter.

2021 Budget Recap – Julie Love presented the final review of our projected and actual spending for 2021. She continued by presenting our **2022 budget** since our 2022 Treasurer was unable to attend the business meeting due to illness. Discussion was held about specific committee budgets and several were increased. Julie made a motion to approve the 2022 budget. Ona Phillips seconded the motion. The membership unanimously approved the budget.

The monthly raffle winners were Sandra Allred, Elaine Bower and Pat Ott.

Julie Love and Elaine Bower shared projects during show and tell.

Adjournment: President Jackie Sabo make a motion to adjourn our meeting at 8:31. It was seconded by Carol Diaz.

- T-shirts fronts or backs- cut up the sides, separate front from back, remove sleeves
- light weight fusible web (not steam a seam) interfacing, enough to cover desired block size + 2"
- Cotton Sashing fabric if desired
- Cutting mat and rotary cutter
- Batting desired finished size plus 4 " w / h or pillow form
- Backing fabric
- Neutral thread
- Sewing machine and other sewing supplies you normally use

2022 Round Robin Quilt

For those of you who were not at the January meeting, we are going to do a Round Robin Quilt for the next eight months. If you are interested in participating, you must bring your first square to the February meeting. You will be given a bag to put your quilt square in, and then you will not see it for the next eight months. You will then get a different bag every month at each guild meeting. Each month, you will

have to make one square and bring it back to the guild meeting the following month. The quilt squares will not be put together. You will be able to put the squares together when you get them back in eight months. Then you can put the squares together anyway you want.

If you would like to participate, please see the following rules.

- 1. Make sure that you are able to get your bag to and from the meeting each month. You can bring it yourself. However, if you cannot attend a meeting, you can ask another guild member to drop off your bag with the finished square and pick up your next bag.
- 2. If you want to participate, please bring in a finished square to the February guild meeting. The square should be between 4 1/2 and 12 1/2 inches. You decide on what size you want to make your squares, and everyone that gets your bag will make the same size.
- 3. In your square, add the colors that you want in your quilt. If there is one particular color you want, you may send it in the bag. Please don't send multiple fabrics. We really want to make these scrappy.
- 4. Each month a different person will make a square for your quilt. If you would like each person to sign the square that they made, please put a pen with your square that they can sign with.
- 5. You will be given an index card to have



COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

Trying something new is always fun and supporting our community is a bonus. The votes for the Outreach program were to support CCM, CVAN, and the Cabarrus County Foster Program. The difference this year is that you may choose one of these three to do your donation quilt, and you can choose when you want to do it. Remember that the quilt is fully done by you including the quilting. For new members and for those who are wanting to learn more about quilting, we plan to do a workshop later in the year to help you. This will include some scraps that can be used in a "scrappy quilt". If you have questions about this, please feel free to ask any of the experienced members or me, and I will do my best to help you or direct you to someone who can. Please give your finished quilt with your name and the charity above in which you wish to make the donation to Carol Harris, and she will mark your contribution for the year. Many of you contributed tops in the last few years, and the guild provided batting, backing and quilting. Because Tom is not up and running yet, the guild will continue to provide the batting and backing on request, but for the time being we will need to rely on volunteers in the guild to do the quilting. I hope this can be remedied sometime during this year, but Tom has not found an answer yet. (See note from Tom.)

The sizes of quilts for these three organizations are: CCM can use twin bed or queen size for those being set up in new homes and lap sizes up to 60 inches long and approximately 40 inches wide for temporary housing including seniors, adults and children. CVAN has always appreciated any size especially for children but also can use lap size for adults. The Foster Care Program can use any size from cuddle size to lap size for infants and teens. We will continue to make bears this Year for Victory Junction. See PROGRAMS for details for the February Workshop. Please feel free to call or email me if you have any questions.

Looking at the used machine market is difficult - I would like a guarantee that the machine worked, or I could return it for my money back. Further the used machines are in Texas or Pennsylvania or the west coast. No real good options! So at present I have not acted.

My thought now is that I should get a new 18-8 sewing machine and use all of my current pieces. I need to find out what machines will adapt to what I have and how expensive that will be. My call is into Liten-Up technology to tell me what my Qbot will adapt to and I'm waiting on a response.

My wish is to be back up and running by May. (Fingers crossed)


