COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

Thank you for your strong participation in this program for 2019. Sixty quilts and 107 bears were sent to Victory Junction this year. 84 quilts were sent to The Concord Hospice and Palliative Care, approximately 200 port-pillows and 150 cancer caps were made. The guild also donated fabrics to Meals on Wheels for gifts, for a girl scout project, and to make dresses for girls in Honduras. Many guild members also made tops for Quilts of Valor or completed blocks to create tops for this organization. This has been A GIVING YEAR.

Because the January meeting will be busy, I wanted to give you a heads-up for 2020 projects so you can get started. We will continue the Hospice and Victory Junction projects for this year. As a reminder, Hospice quilts are approximately 38" wide and not more than 60" long. Victory Junction likes larger quilts, approximately 45" by 72" but can use even larger for auction purposes. However, you do not need to limit your patterns if they are wider or longer than this. The guild will provide batting and even some backings for these two organizations if you just want to furnish the tops. Backing material and even wide batting pieces can be donated and will be put to use. This will allow our supplies to stretch further.

We will continue to use Fire Station # 9 usually on the third Friday of the month. The January meeting cannot be set before the end of December so will let you know when this date is confirmed. We will need to start on the bears in January and I will have materials to make kits and start on the bears. I plan to have a workshop at the firestation in February on how to make the bears. However, you can do any charity project at any of the firestation get togethers.

For new quilters, this is a good time to get ideas and help on making a quilt. You can also get help in making your CVAN quilt. It is also a good time to get to know other quilt members. Hope to see you there.

I am always open to any charity project that might be near and dear to your heart. If you have any ideas you want to share or any questions, please contact me.

2020 QUILT SHOW

There is a plan to have a booth that will allow guild members to sell items such as past show quilts that you have stored away, Christmas items such as tree skirts, ornaments table runners and other craft projects. Details will need to be worked out such as the percentage to the guild.Jo Ann Hahn will be in charge of this project. This is not be in place of Silent Auction but probably be connected in some way. Feed back on this idea is important to Jo Ann.

I will always try and be available to answer questions when I can or help guide you in finding them. Mainly I want to listen and be open to any of your ideas. Since in the past, I have not been dependent on my email and Connie is, I would like any questions or comments be sent to her as she will be my secretary and relay all messages to me. I think we have an exciting adventure ahead of us and looking forward to getting to know you through this strong commitment.




