Get Involved

2021 MYSTERY QUILT

If you have a large scrap stash this is a fun quilt. You may choose to make the top from all scraps for both the dark & light fabrics or use dark scraps & one single light background fabric. Or maybe you have a jelly roll you are dying to use. Or maybe you have been saving 2 fabrics just looking the right pattern.

Remember that "light" or "background" fabric in a quilt can be something other than white or cream colored fabric. If you want hot pink as background great! Do what you want. After all it is your quilt.

What you need to know

There are 6 clues. A new clue will be issued every month. The last clue will be given in June, so you have 2 months to finish your quilt for August meeting. Hopefully, we will be able to meet by then.

Blocks will finish to 8" in the quilt (8 1/2" unfinished)

Number of blocks Wall hanging 25 blocks (5 x 5) Lap quilt 35 blocks (5 x 7)

Difficulty

Learning experience for beginners (working with points & half-square triangles). Fun for experienced quilters. Great way to use up that accumulated scrap stash.

Fabric requirements

Good contrast between light & dark fabrics is suggested. You may close either light or dark background. Instructions will show a light background.

The following are the suggested quantities:

	Fat Eights	Background Fabric
Wall hanging	8 (1 yd if only using two colors)	1 to 1 ½ yds
Lap quilt	14 (1 ³ ⁄ ₄ yd if only using two colors)	2 yds

<u>NOTE</u>: Fabric requirements shown above are ONLY for the pieced portion of the quilt top. You will want additional fabric for borders (1/3 yd for wall hanging, ½ yd for laptop quilt). If you are making pieced borders you will want a couple additional fat eights.

Let's get started!

<u>Instructions:</u> From background fabric, cut 9 strips 2 ¹/₂" wide. Cross cut to make 2 ¹/₂" squares.

Wall hanging cut 148 2 ¹/₂" squares

Lap quilt cut 208 2 ¹/₂" squares

SUGGESTION AFTER EACH CLUE IS FINISHED PUT IN A ZIP LOCK BAG & LABEL TO PREVENT CONFUSION.
