Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.

Customers would travel hours to buy US newspapers like the NY Times and Atlanta Journal, and international magazines and newspapers like Der Spiegel and The Guardian.

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the CQG?

I have been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild for 15 years. After I sold my bookstores, I met 2 ladies who introduced me to quilting. I talked Pat into teaching quilting classes at the YMCA, so I could take classes from her. My other friend June introduced me to fabrics! Whoever has enough fabrics?!?

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting? Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

I am a German native, and learned to sew from my Mom who was a master seamstress and never used a pattern. I emigrated to the United States with my first husband. When I came to the United States, my mother-in-law taught me how to sew with patterns. I made my daughter's layette and sewed our clothes for at least 10 years. To make extra money, I taught sewing classes in our basement in Lancaster, NY.

I have a longarm machine that I have not mastered.

My first husband and I eloped to Gretna Green, Scotland!

Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

I enjoy trying new recipes, entertaining family and friends and puttering around in my garden. I also love travelling, when it's safe to do so.

Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.


Oh goodness! Where to start? I am a wife, mother, mother-in-law, grandmother, sister, sister- in-law, aunt, friend, neighbor, quilter (!) and child of God! My husband is a retired Navy dentist, and we have moved all around the world. We moved here almost 2 years ago to be near our son and daughter-in-law who have twin 7-year-olds and a 5-year-old - all boys!

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the COG?

In August of 2018, we sold our house in Roanoke, VA and moved to Concord. While waiting for our house to be complete, we lived with our son. My daughter-in- law, knowing my love for quilting, took me to the Cabarrus Quilt Guild Show, and I was totally impressed and immediately picked up information on joining the guild. I actually didn't join until January of 2019 due to getting settled in our new home.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting? Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

During our tour in Winter Harbor, Maine, the Navy Wives Club invited a quilter named Marion Bagley to come and teach us Precision Hand Quilting. I was immediately hooked! That was just over 35 years ago and I have been quilting ever since!



What is your favorite part of the quilting process? What is your favorite technique?

I love handwork, but I also enjoy piecing, particularly paper piecing for the wonderful precision it provides. I struggled to enjoy quilting on my domestic machine, but 4 years ago I was able to purchase a used Gammill Longarm machine that I dearly love! Boom! Problem solved!! I have always enjoyed sewing, crafting, needlepoint, crewel, crossstitch, chair caning and basket weaving but when I started quilting, almost everything else fell to the side! I particularly like art quilts and the creative process of watching my creation come alive in fabric.



What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know?

I have participated in a number of challenges that, as a whole, have gone on to become quite popular. For example, I did a quilt for the National Parks 100th Anniversary challenge and it was then published in a beautiful hard covered book and hung at many quilts shows, including Houston! I also have a quilt in the first edition of Manholes Covers of Japan and a quilt in the book Celebrate the Day.


Wow, there is so much out there to see and learn from in the quilting arena . Here's a few I enjoyed. The Quilters Calendar- MMQuilters@gmail.com

> My Favorite Quilt By Angie Graeber


My favorite quilt is what I see Whenver I from work can flee; It calls my name and begs me come along And lures me with its siren song.


