# **Last Meeting Minutes**

Cabarrus Quilters' Guild Minutes of General Membership Meeting Monday – June 8, 2021

**Call to Order:** President Sandra Allred called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm. She welcomed everyone to the first in person meeting since February 2020. The meeting was held at Rocky River Presbyterian Church.

**Approval of Minutes:** Carol Harris moved to approve our May minutes and Lisa Edwards seconded. The minutes were approved.

We had many visitors – Joyce Hobgood, Nina Suddeth, Jo Hysell, Karen Bebout, Denise Hunter, Shonna Rodgers, and Anita Black.

### **Committee Updates:**

**President**: The plan is to meet at Rocky River through August. Forest Hill is establishing new rules for use of their facilities. We hope to have a copy of them soon and at that time we will review the rules and get a guild vote on where we want to meet. We can continue to meet at Rocky River on Tuesday evenings or go back to Forest Hill on Mondays.

Our workshop on Tuesday is a charity sew and will be here from 9-3. Bring your machine and sewing supplies along with white or neutral fabric for framing blocks. The rest will be provided by Connie & Tom and board members. You can also bring a charity piece you are already working on. This is an excellent time for new sewers to work on a simple quilt pattern and receive help from experienced sewers. Bring your own lunch or we can head to Harrisburg to pick something up. If you can't join us the whole time, come for as long as you can. We have silent auction items that need finishing. If you can complete one, please see Jo Ann Hahn or Terry Patterson.

Tonight we are going back to our original **meeting raffle** format. Jackie has tickets for sale. We will have the drawing after our break, so you have time to buy tickets if you haven't yet. Please be generous in your ticket purchases these upcoming meetings. We haven't raised any raffle money for 16 months. All our raffle items are from donations.

Our **By-laws committee** is hard at work reviewing and rewriting our by-laws. Please read your newsletter emails. The changes will be published in the newsletter and in the body of the email so you don't have to search for them in the newsletter. Several options were discussed – covered dish provided by members, we can purchase a boxed lunch, BYOM or just have desserts provided by the board. The Guild will provide drinks. 
**July Program and Workshop**

## **BY-LAWS REVISION**

According to Article X of our by-laws, the proposed changes of the By-laws Revision Committee must run in two consecutive newsletters before the Membership can vote on these changes. Below are the proposed changes for Articles I-III of the by-laws. If a quorum is present at the August meeting, we will vote on these changes. The new proposed by-laws are in the left column. Changes are underlined. Our current bylaws are in the right column.

#### **Article II**

### **Motto & Purpose**

Motto: "To instill in future generations the love and art of quilt making."

Purpose: We encourage excellence of craftsmanship and foster a sense of beauty in color and design by providing programs, workshops, and classes for Cabarrus Quilters Guild members, other quilt guilds, and/or members of the community. Our guild meetings and quilt shows provide opportunities for the exchange of ideas/information and promote interest in quilting as an art within the community. Our guild's community outreach program creates and distributes comfort quilts to local non-profit organizations that serve the community.

## **Article III Membership**

Section 1: Membership:

- Membership is subject to the payment of dues. Each member is responsible for making a comfort quilt and selling raffle quilt tickets to remain in good standing. Membership will be granted to any person regardless of race, creed, color, sex or national origin, who is interested in the art of quilting.
- Members have access to the guild library, workshops, newsletter, and are encouraged to participate in board and committee roles.
- A junior membership is offered to any school age child under 18. All junior members under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult member.

## **Current Bylaws**

## **Article II Motto & Purpose**

Motto: "To instill in future generations the love and art of quilt making."

Purpose: We encourage excellence of craftsmanship and foster a sense of beauty in color and design by providing programs, workshops, and classes for Cabarrus Quilters Guild members, other guilt guilds, and/or members of the community. Our guild meetings and quilt shows provide opportunities for the exchange of ideas/information and promote interest in quilting as an art within the community. Our guild's community outreach program includes, but is not limited to, providing quilts to children in crisis through our yearly cuddle quilt donations to CVAN.

## **Article III Membership**

Section 1: Membership:

> Membership is subject only to the payment of dues and shall be granted to any person regardless of race, creed, color, sex or national origin, who is interested in the art of quilting.

A junior membership may be offered to any school age child under 18 if accompanied by an adult member.

## **BY-LAWS REVISION CONTINUED**

## **Proposed Changes**

### Section 2: Dues:

• Dues are payable in January of each year. <u>Dues</u> are half the annual amount from July to

<u>December for new members</u>. All member/junior member dues shall be set by recommendation of the Executive Board and an affirmative vote of the majority of a quorum of the membership.

Visitors are welcome to two (2) free visits.

#### Section 3: Comfort Quilts:

• Each member including junior members shall be responsible for one comfort quilt per year.

#### Section 4: Raffle Tickets:

• Each adult member shall be responsible for selling the minimum of number of raffle tickets.

## **Current Bylaws**

#### Section 2: Dues:

• Dues are payable in January of each year. Dues are half the annual amount from July to December for new members or anyone who has not held a membership in the past twelve (12) months. All member/junior member dues shall be set by recommendation of the Executive Board and an affirmative vote of the majority of a quorum of the membership. Visitors are welcome to two (2) free visits.

#### Section 3: Cuddle Ouilts:

• Each member/junior member shall be responsible for at least, but not limited to, one cuddle quilt per year. Cuddle quilts are due at the November meeting each year and will be donated to Cabarrus Victims Assistance Network ("CVAN") in November or December of each year.

#### Section 4: Raffle Tickets:

• Each adult member shall be responsible for selling a minimum of twenty-five (25) raffle tickets for the raffle quilt each year.

Below are the proposed changes for Articles VII-XI of the by-laws. If a quorum is present at the Septmeber meeting, we will vote on these changes. The new proposed by-laws are in the left column. Changes are underlined. Our current bylaws are in the right column.

## **Proposed Changes**

## Article VII: Committees

Section 1: Committee Chairs:

• Committee chairpersons shall be appointed by the President and will include activities, audit, community outreach, <u>hospitality</u>, librarian, <u>membership</u>, <u>newsletter</u>, programs, <u>public</u> <u>relations</u>, quilt show, raffle quilt, webmaster and any other which is deemed necessary. All chairpersons are responsible for appointing committee members to assist with committee projects if needed.

## **Current Bylaws**

#### **Article VII: Committees**

Section 1: Committee Chairs:

• Committee chairpersons shall be appointed by the President and will include activities, audit, community outreach, finance, historian, humanitarian & hospitality, librarian, newsletter & membership, programs, quilt show, raffle quilt, webmaster and any other which is deemed necessary. All chairpersons are responsible for appointing committee members to assist with committee projects if needed.

## BY-LAWS REVISION CONTINUED

In ArticleVII, Section 2, the by-laws committee shorten the job description of each committee chairperson. These are the new descriptions. Additionally, some committee positions have been added and deleted.

#### Section 2: Duties of Committee Chairpersons:

- Activities Committee Chairperson
  - o Organize various activities for guild members.
- Audit Committee Chairperson
  - Audit the Treasurer's accounts at the close of the fiscal year and report findings at the January Business meeting.
- Community Outreach Committee Chairperson
  - o Coordinate the efforts of members in making charitable projects in and/or around Cabarrus County.
- Hospitality Committee Chairperson
  - Coordinate refreshments for the monthly guild meetings and send special occasion cards to members.
- Library Committee Chairperson
  - o Create and maintain a practical and inspirational library collection for the membership's use.
- Membership Committee Chairperson
  - o Maintain the membership list and greet members and guests at guild meetings.
- Newsletter Committee Chairperson
  - o Ensure members receive timely information via the newsletter.
- Program Committee Chairperson
  - Ensure that quality speakers are scheduled to present a variety of programs and workshops to meet the needs of the guild.
- Public Relations Committee Chairperson
  - o Build and maintain a positive public social media profile.
- Quilt Show Committee Chairperson
  - o Organize and coordinate all aspects involved in the quilt show.
- Raffle Quilt Committee Chairperson
  - o Coordinate the creation of a queen size or larger quilt to raise money for our Guild and Cabarrus Victims Assistance Network (CVAN).
- Website Committee Chairperson
  - Oversee the maintenance of the website and ensure information is current.

Intent to amend the Bylaws shall be published in the next two monthly newsletters, and voting on the proposed amendments shall take place at the first Guild meeting following such publication at which a quorum is present. Amendments require approval of the majority of a quorum to pass. Any amendments to these Bylaws will require the Guild to reapply for Section 501(c)(3) status with the Internal Revenue Service.

#### **Article XI: Conflicts of Interest Policy**

• Amendments to the Bylaws may be proposed at any monthly Guild meeting. # COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

Thanks to all of you, we exceeded our goal to Victory Junction. We delivered 100 bears and 71 quilts the first week in June. We just delivered 21 quilts to Hospice making a total of 39 in 2021 so far. You can see all of these online thanks to Terry Patterson who took all the pictures and posted them. To all of you who made contributions in making bears, made quilt tops, quilted or did bindings, thank you. We can be proud of our contributions to the community.

I want to share a thank you from a VJ camper who received one of our bears. Lia says she cherishes the bears she has received from her camping experiences and has big plans for her future and the bears. She wants to become a first grade teacher and "the bears will have a special place in her classroom. They will be placed in a designated area where students will be able to practice their reading skills to the bears." What an inspiring plan.

My name was given to a mother of a teen who attended the camp and explained what the bear meant to her daughter. It had helped her through homesickness while she was at camp. Her daughter is part of a hometown group (Denton, NC) who wants to give back. This group wants to collect what it takes to make bears and learn the process. At this time, I don't know how many girls this will involve but I am working with the mother to make this happen. I wanted to give you a heads up as I may need help in teaching the girls.
