Frosty The Snowman Collage Wall Quilt Supply List Background Fabric 22 x 22 (provided in kit) Ground Fabric 5 x 22 (suggest blue) Snowman, ground drifts 1/2 yd (white, white on white) Fat quarter or scraps Black Hat, buttons, face (provided in Brown scrap for twig hands (provided in kit) Orange scrap for nose (provided in Kit) Scarf/ hat band fat quarter or scrap (I used wool) Flowers/ birds scraps as many as you like to use Black border and backing of choice Light box Teflon pressing sheet Scissors(to cut paper) Scissors (to cut flowers) Tape/ sharpie Steam A Seam 2 and or Lite Heat N Bond (I use both) **Tweezers** MonoPoly thread (raw edge quilting)

She wants to match them up with pajamas which I think is an excellent idea. We will resume CCM donations next month. The director did say they were going to people settling into their "Grandfather House "right now. I want to give a special thanks to Barbara Horne-Stead. She donated 5 big quilts she



completed herself, took over 10 tops to bind from the last meeting and had completed several other bindings from the month before. And kudos to Melba who keeps Tom busy with tops to quilt. It is a wonderful way to fill these hot days. Thanks to all of you for your help in this program. Every quilt is special and has its own story.

We just finished the QAYG (quilt-as-you-go) with Cathey Hooper and it was an excellent program. It is a workshop that Tom and I will work on together to complete a charity quilt. I have always enjoyed batiks and have a collection of at least 20 years of scraps that is being used for this. Thanks, Cathey for your clear directions and patience. All in attendance felt this was worthwhile.

The next Fire Station #9 event will be July 15th. This will be the third Friday instead of the usual second Friday of the month. The time is from 9 until 3. Mary Shea donated so many delightful children's prints and gave me directions to do "I Spy" quilts for children. I also have many scraps left over from doing the bears so these will be put to good use also. This is an event that you can come and be useful even if you

don't want to bring your machine. We will make kits with 3" squares that can be taken home and put together later. So with or without a machine, there will be plenty to do. If you want to just cut out, plan to bring your own cutter and a small cutting mat if you have one. If you have children's prints that you want to use, you are more than welcome to bring them but not necessary. This should be fun. Thanks Mary for all your wonderful donations. She also brought me some quilts that just need hand binding. She even has the thread. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me. Hope to see you in July.
