#### April 2014 - Minutes

The meeting began at 6:45 p.m. The social period was open from 6:15 to 6:45 during which refreshments were served, visitors greeted, sign ups (workshops, greeters, refreshments) occurred and members paid dues. Refreshments were provided by: Sharron Brown, Martha Austin, Cathy Gordon-Hallman.

Vice President Sharon Smith opened the meeting by welcoming visitors and new members.

Pat Arndt welcomed speaker Jane Godshall of Plain Jane Threads. Jane demonstrated English paper piecing using hexagons and diamonds and demonstrated paper-less piecing as well as gave an overview of new tools for making the Lemoyne Star and Hunter Star.

Candy gave a brief run-down of June, July and August's programs. In June we will only have a speaker, not a workshop. July is Micki Dupree (rescheduled) and August will be the picnic and guild challenge. More sign-ups are needed and members were reminded to pay for workshops by the meeting the month before the program. Six members who participated in the Karen Combs workshop showed their projects.

Candy McManaway discussed guild activities. She invited members to show the blocks they have been working on for block of the month. Nancy Miller advised that everyone should have Clue 3 for the mystery quilt. Clue 4 will be sent to all participants before next meeting. If you still want to join the mystery, contact Nancy.

Fourteen members showed quilts and projects they had completed. Several quilts and projects were shown as well as an antique quilt. Several members draped their projects over benches and tables for members to inspect at break. May birthdays were recognized with a fat quarter for the members present.

Announcements: We need greeters for next month's meeting. Debbie Morse is coordinating the sale of raffle quilt tickets with the Kannapolis Art Festival on May 31<sup>st</sup>, September 27<sup>th</sup> and October 25th.

Sew Saturday will be working on a string quilt block this Saturday. Traditional paper-piecing will be taught in June and Barbara Bruce will teach making a large tote bag in July.

Silent auction committee is looking for projects to be made/finished for silent auction. White elephant committee is looking for items for the White Elephant booth. Ona Phillips gave a QOV report. There is a new block pattern this year they will be collecting in July. Community outreach delivered 112 teddy bears to Victory Junction on May 3. Black & white check fabric will be available later this summer/fall so we can make bears again, and they will make kits too. Community Outreach also delivered 25 mini bears to CMC-Northeast NICU on May 10. Patterns were distributed for the NICU bears. Nancy Miller showed the remake of a large quilt brought in—it was made for a Hospice quilt. If you have unfinished projects, contact Community Outreach to get them completed for a hospice quilt. Batting, quilting, and labels are available for hospice guilts. Pat Stedwell announced that BJs memberships are available. They renew later in the year, but if you join now, membership would be prorated. Marguerite announced that Raffle tickets will be sold on race weekend at the Depot on McGill. Sharon thanked the refreshment committee for providing refreshments. The door prize was drawn. A reminder that the next meeting is June 9. The meeting was adjourned at 8:39 p.m.

Even though I have been sewing clothes for myself and the children since I was seventeen years old, I

have only been quilting since 2005. Carolyn Edwards was making a lap quilt from Doris Kelly. I still have the 12 squares that I was to quilt by hand. I will quilt them by machine when I decide to finish the quilt. I joined this quilt guild in October 2005 and have not regretted one moment. So many ladies with so much patience and talent, that now I count myself as a good intermediate quilter. One of my favorite projects is to work on Quilts of Valor and to go on quilting retreats with guild members.

### Sew What's Cooking?



## Tomato-Potato-Zucchini-Summer Squash

1 Tbsp. Olive Oil
1 medium onion
2 cloves of garlic
1 medium zucchini
1 medium yellow squash
1 large white potato
1 large tomato
1 tsp. dried Thyme
1 tsp. fresh chopped Rosemary
Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup shredded Italian cheese

STEP 1: Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Finely dice the onion and mince the garlic. Sauté onions in a skillet with olive oil until softened (roughly 5

minutes) then add the garlic until fragrant (about 1-2 minutes).

STEP 2: While the onion and garlic are sautéing, thinly slice the rest of the vegetables. Slice them into the same shape. I used a mandolin but you could also use a food processor or by hand as well (just try to get them to be as close to the same thickness as possible)

STEP 3: Spray the inside of an 8×8 square or round baking dish with non-stick spray. Spread the softened onion and garlic in the bottom of the dish. Place the thinly sliced vegetables in the baking dish vertically, in an alternating pattern. Sprinkle generously with salt, pepper, thyme, and rosemary.

STEP 4: Cover the dish with foil and bake for 30 minutes. Remove the foil, top with cheese and bake for another 15-20 minutes or until the cheese is golden brown.

#### Sew Helpful Hints & Tricks

- 1. Fleece is a thread magnet. To keep threads from migrating throughout the house, wear fleece when sewing. You are a mess but the floor is cleaner.
- Use the tray that comes in cookie packages as a space organizer for sewing notions. Two of these trays perfectly fit a drawer space with long dividers for items such as seam rippers, rulers, scissors, etc. Re-using these trays is a great way to recycle and they come in many sizes. When these wear out, just eat more cookies to get more trays.
- When drawing lines on squares to make Triangle-Squares and Flying Geese units, use an emery board as a straight edge. It won't slip, and keeps the fabric from stretching as you draw.
- 4. Pick up a toilet brush from the dollar store and keep it in the sewing room. At the end of a long quilting session, just skim the brush over the carpet to catch all those loose threads before they get tangled up in the vacuum roller bar. Works like a charm!


