Member Spotlight-Carol Eicher



Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.

I live in Concord and have been married to Jack for almost 49 years. We have 3 married adult children and 9 grandchildren, I taught Family & Consumer Sciences at the high school level for 21 years and worked with a GEARUP grant at Eastern Kentucky University for 3.5 years. I now run an embroidery business from my home.

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the CQG?

I have been a member of CQG for 10 years. I attended the CQG Quilt Show in October of 2010 and decided I wanted to be a part of a quilting group that put a show on so well.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting?

I have been quilting for 21 years, but I have been sewing seriously since my junior year in high school. I always loved looking at and admiring quilts. When I was teaching, I had a sewing class. We sewed shorts, sweatshirts, pillows or stuffed animals. Sewing seemed to be less and less popular at that time, so I was looking for something else to give my students more depth and a different skill. A teacher at another school told me she had her students making quilts from Quilt in a Day, and they loved it. I had found my answer. I turned my class into making Quilt in a Day quilts. By incorporating Arts and Humanities and entrepreneurship into my curriculum, I had found the depth I wanted for my students. Of course, I was then hooked on making quilts myself.

Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

My grandmother was blind since I was 6 months old. She always had us describe in great detail any new clothing item we had gotten. She always would feel the texture of it. I have always thought she had much to do with my love for fiber, thread and fabric. My mother sewed a lot when I was young. She and my aunt would get together and sew while the cousins played. My mom also did hand embroidery and taught me to so. We did make some doll clothes together. However, she never made any quilts. I have a cousin that taught me to knit when I was in the 5th grade. I knitted for years.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process? Least favorite? Favorite technique?

I enjoy the piecing of quilts the most, but love all of it. My least favorite is sewing on the binding before the hand stitching and mitering the corners. I really enjoy quilting the quilts I make on my embroidery machine.

What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know? Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

Something many in the Guild would not know about me is the fact that I love riding my bicycle on Rails to Trails across the country. My husband and I have ridden in 18 states. That fact also says I love to travel. I am also a hiker and will hike anywhere I can find a forest with a trail. I adore my 9 grandkids and love being active with them – hiking, biking, travel.



Member Spotlight-Darlene Woodham



Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.

I am originally from Spokane, Washington, but I have lived in North Carolina for most of my life. I have one son and one grandson, and I live in Concord with my husband and my poodle Eva.

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the COG?

I joined the Guild in 2016. I joined, so I could learn more about quilting.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting?

I have been quilting about 30 years. I took a class at a fabric store in Fayetteville, and I made a 4 block sampler quilt, which I then hand quilted.

Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

No one else in my family that I know of was a quilter, but my mother sewed. She let me use her sewing machine, and I taught myself (mostly) to sew clothing for myself.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process? Least favorite? Favorite technique?

Piecing is the most satisfying part of quilting for me. I don't really have a least favorite part, but I would say the machine quilting part has been the most challenging for the last few years, and I have been working at developing my skills in that area. I like paper piecing and machine applique. I like learning new things too.

What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know?

The most fun thing I ever did was a tandem skydive. (Jumping out of an airplane). It was spectacular!

Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

I really enjoy walking on the beach looking for shells and other interesting things. I also like to read. This years goal has been 3 books a month, and so far I an on schedule. Since I retired in 2015, I have a lot of time on my hands and quilting has kept me busy and for that I am grateful.




Please remember that each member is responsible for selling 25 raffle tickets each year as stated in our by-laws.


