# Last Meeting Minutes

Cabarrus Quilters Guild  
Minutes of General Membership Meeting  
Monday – February 10, 2020

President, Lisa Schreck opened the meeting at 6:30 pm. We had two visitors this month – Katey Ramsey and Ellie Bremer. We had one new member join – Kathryn Callahan. Carol Harris reminded everyone to put their cards for their Secret Quilter in the mailbox at the entrance table and explained that each month you are to provide a hint about yourself and a card (and/or a small gift) for your Secret Quilter.

Sandra Allred made a motion to approve the January minutes and Carol Harris seconded.

Colleen Sain, Membership Chair, announced that we currently have 74 guild members. Terry Patterson added that the 2020 Guild Directory will be emailed by the end of February. We will have printed copies available to purchase for \$3.00 at the March meeting.

Julie Love, Treasurer, discussed setting up an audit committee to review the books monthly. Sandra Allred, Rosey Stein and Ona Phillips volunteered for the audit committee. Debbie Morse, 2019 Audit Committee, announced that the 2019 records were reviewed and no discrepancies were noted.

Cynthia Belton, Welcome Committee Chair, explained that the goals of the committee were to provide a welcoming environment for visitors and new members. A reserved table will be provided at each meeting. They will have purple chair back covers. The committee has packets prepared for new members.

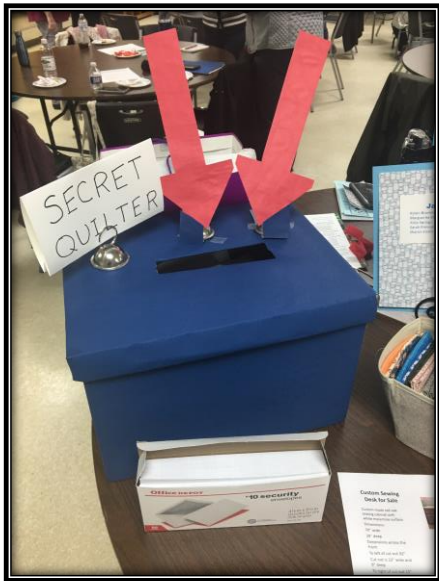

# Get Involved

## ACTIVITIES

### Secret Quilter

Each guild member selected a secret quilter name at the January meeting. Each meeting from February through November you will submit an envelope in the **'Secret Quilter Mailbox'** for the quilter chosen. In the envelope should be small gift like fabric or thread, and a small note with a hint about yourself to help the quilter guess the identity of the quilter who chose their name. At the November meeting, quilters will guess the name of their secret quilter. Block print the name of the quilter on the outside of the envelope. If you miss a meeting, submit two envelopes at the next meeting. Submit two envelopes in advance if you know you will miss a meeting if you prefer. If you missed choosing a quilter in January, we will have a secondary drawing. If you need to drop out of the secret quilter, please talk to an activities committee member.



### Guild Challenge

The Guild Challenge for 2020 is Cabarrus County. What is your favorite thing or place about Cabarrus County? Your family? History? Grandchildren's activities? Your activities? Your church? Maybe a memory from your childhood for the Cabarrus County natives. Your quilt must be finished, quilted & bound. You can make any size you wish but we request an approximate size by the July meeting so we can be prepared to display your quilt. Submit your quilt in a plain bag at the **August** picnic and include an index card explaining what your quilt represents. Any label must be covered so the guild members can vote on their favorite.

### Block of the Month

The BOM for 2020 will run from February through July. Each guild member participating in this activity is asked to make two different blocks, 9 ½ by 9 ½ to turn in each month to the activities committee. Members will pick fabric from scraps the activities committee will provide. Members may add unbleached muslin for background if needed. Do not use your own fabric from home. If you miss a meeting you can bring the blocks to the next meeting. All blocks should be turned in by the August meeting. The blocks turned in will be used as a challenge later in the year. Quilts made from the blocks will be given to CVAN.

Turn in One of Each Type of Block for Each Month:

- March – Squares / Diamonds
- April – Hexagons / Strips
- May – Dresden / Crazy Patch
- June – Log Cabin / Flying Geese
- July – Pinwheel / Applique or Paper Piecing

## MARCH SPEAKER

**Kathleen Rountree** recently moved to the North Carolina mountains, bringing with her one husband, two cats and 9 sewing machines! A pianist and University professor, quilting has been a constant in her life since age 9. During her time in California, she was inspired to begin using vintage linens and laces in her quilting. Her resulting works, which she will feature in her trunk show, have been noted in the most important US quilt shows, including the Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival, the Savannah Quilt Fest, Road to California, Quiltweek Paducah, and the Pennsylvania Quilt Extravaganza. Her work will be featured in an individual Artist's Gallery at the Summer 2020 Birmingham Festival of Quilts, the largest show in Europe.

Kathleen now lives in Hendersonville, NC, and has increased her sewing machine count to ten! In addition to making competitive quilts, she is an active maker of donation and charity quilts, is a Guild member in both Hendersonville and Asheville, and is also active in judging quilt shows and festivals.
