

Membership: Jackie Sabo reminded members that dues of \$35 and are now past due. A new electronic directory will be published in February. Supply List:

- T-shirts fronts or backs- cut up the sides, separate front from back, remove sleeves
- light weight fusible web (not steam a seam) interfacing, enough to cover desired block size + 2"

- Cotton Sashing fabric if desired
- Cutting mat and rotary cutter
- Batting desired finished size plus 4 " w / h or pillow form
- Backing fabric
- Neutral thread
- Sewing machine and other sewing supplies you normally use

April 11th Program and April 12th Workshop

Darleen Woodham will be sharing with us the art of modern quilting. Tuesday's workshop will be an opportunity to make a modern-design wall hanging. There are three sizes to choose from; check out the samples at the program table.



GOOD NEWS! Tom's machine is up and running thanks to Ken and John from K and J Sewing and More in Rockwell. They figured out that we needed a new wiring harness, ordered the part and came to our house to install it. Tom is busy finishing up the tops donated last year and has started on Melba's donations for this year. What a great feeling to be back in business. We are so grateful to Ken and John.

The workshop was a great success. Five new people learned to make bears from beginning to end. Three people worked on sewing bears and the rest cut out arms and legs and bear patterns. At this time we have 12 completed bears, 22 ready for stuffing and several kits ready to be sewn. I can bring kits to the next meeting, or deliver to the Wesleyan Church in Kannapolis on Tuesday. I also have arms and legs if you want to use your own materials. I will have a stuffing and closing party later in March. If you want to stuff at home, I can give you stuffing. I had a large donation from the Dogwood Group in Denton. I will let you know when I have made the arrangements for the group stuffing party.

A reminder: Carol Harris will be keeping track of your completed quilt. Be sure you tell her where your quilt is to go when you turn it in. Remember it is to go to one of the three choices voted on at the January meeting (CVAN, CCM, or Cabarrus County Foster Program.) The ones you want Tom to quilts should be marked with your preference. If it is not, we will decide where the present need may be.


