Mildred Lamb - "Sew Tuesday" Leader

I made my first quilt in the mid 1970's. While shopping for groceries at the A&P, I saw a quilt on the cover of a magazine. It was four leaves appliqued onto white squares. I bought the magazine and the rest is history. I cut all the leaves from scraps and the background squares from an old sheet as instructed. Every day at work I appliqued the leaves during break and lunchtime. When I completed the quilt, I wasn't sure if I ever wanted to applique again but could hardly wait to start another quilt.

I visited Grandma's Quilt Shop owned by Fay West who invited me to join her group of ladies she was organizing as The Cabarrus County Happy Quilters Club. Eventually the name was changed to Cabarrus Quilters Guild. In the beginning we met at member's homes, but as membership grew we began meeting at the Cabarrus Senior Center. The meeting was the second Monday of every month and still continues today. When I retired I began attending the Sew Tuesdays. After awhile I kind of just fell into the position of "go to" person for information. We meet the 1st Tuesday (9-12) and the 3rd Tuesday (9-4) of each month at the Senior Center.



Carol Harris – "Sew Saturday" Leader

I grew up in rural Nebraska and learned to sew at an early age from my mother. I received my first quilt from my husband's grandmother when she hand pieced a baby quilt for our son. When our daughter came along Momma Harris had passed away and I decided my daughter needed a baby quilt as well. Really, just how hard could that be? I'd been sewing for years! Nice try. Yes it kept her warm but we quickly put it in the bottom of the drawer. Fast forward to the kids leaving the nest I found I had time on my hands and wanted to try quilting again. This time I took an actual quilting class and I was hooked. What a difference just one class can make. I joined the guild after reading an article in the paper inviting anyone interested to come to a guild meeting. The guild needed a place to hold Sew Saturday so I asked my manager at Bonitz for permission to use the Fred Pinkston Training Room. Since we do not typically work on the weekends it was a perfect fit for the guild. Little did I know that 2 years later I would be elected guild president. I enjoyed my time in office but missed getting to know new members. Now I spend my quilting hours working on projects mostly requested by my children and friends. Best part about giving away the quilt is I know where the mistakes are but no one else even bothers to look they just enjoy the quilt.

Sew Who Doesn't Love Brownies?



37 CALORIES BROWNIES

3/4 cup nonfat Greek yogurt (I used vanilla)
1/4 cup skim milk
1/2 cup Cocoa powder
1/2 cup Old fashioned rolled oats (like Quaker)
1/2 cup Truvia (or any natural/stevia based
sweetener that pours like sugar)
1 egg
1/3 cup applesauce
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 pinch salt

Preheat the oven to 400°F. Grease a square baking dish (I used 8"x8"). Combine all ingredients into a food processor or a blender, and blend until smooth (about 1 minute). Pour into the prepared dish and bake for about 15 minutes. Allow to cool completely before cutting into 9 large squares

Sew Helpful Hints & Tricks

- Before starting a new quilt, transfer the cutting instructions to a dry erase board. As you cut, erase that size and move on. It's easier than looking at the instructions in the magazine.
- 2. Use plastic folders to make patterns for English Paper Piecing. Instead of making piles of patterns out of card stock, you only need to make a few of these and use them over and over again. Trace the

pattern, cut it out, and punch a hole in the center. Then fold the fabric over the plastic template, and take a stitch at each corner. To remove the template, insert an orange stick or small dowel into the hole, and pull up until the plastic piece comes loose.

- 3. If you have accidentally fused an appliqué in the wrong place, use a fabric softener dryer sheet as a pressing cloth to loosen the web so you can remove the appliqué to reposition it.
- To keep track of small tools while working on a project, wear a carpenter's apron and slip your tools into the pockets.


