Cross-stitch was my favorite and I continued it into adulthood. But what inspired me most were 2 elderly ladies my husband and I befriended our first year of marriage. They were both seamstresses and both made quilts. That's when my interest in quilting started.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process?

Piecing

I like applique and paper piecing. Just sewing is fun for me©.

As your quilt show chairman, I have recently had a conversation with our president, Lisa Schreck. Because the time frame for continued distancing is unknown, we have decided to move this year's quilt show from Gibson Mills to a "virtual" format that is acceciable through the Cabarrus Quilters website.

We will still have judging and prizes for the "best quilts" in each category. The only difference is that the quilts will be shown "on line" at our web site as a virtual quilt show.

I know you will have lots of questions about the different phases that have been a part of our previous quilt shows, such as vendors, silent auction, and other topics we have discussed for this year's show. One of the new areas we talked about is for you to sell quilts and the details still need to be worked out. Hopefully by August we will be able to get the committees together and work out all details. In the meantime, we will communicate by email or phone calls. Please contact me with any questions.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

Like many of you, since we are all staying in, I am missing guild meetings, members, family, and friends. I know what we are doing is helping each other to stay safe and that is the biggest gift we can give each other. We do have one thing going for us and that is our talents in creating through our sewing. Terry Patterson has just emailed me to say that the guild has created over 5000 face masks for Atrium Health Care. What a feat in itself. I just sent 7 finished quilts for Hospice with Debbie Morse. Since these can not be shared at the guild meeting I will put the pictures on

<u>CQGshowandtell@gmail.com</u>. This gives us a total of 25 quilts we have given to Hospice so far in 2020.

Get Involved

I finally got through to Victory Junction and as everyone else is doing, they are working from home. The summer programs will be done by virtual camp on the internet. She said that one child has the virus and of course they rely so heavily on volunteers that this can not be controlled. However, the Director of Special Events said that they will be sending out care and love packages to the campers and was excited that we are continuing our contribution of bears and quilts. At this time, I have 60 completed bears at my house but I know of at least 30 that are done by members and I am sure the other 10 are covered by members who took kits at the last meeting. Tom has been kept busy quilting hospice and Victory Junction quilts and has only one more to do. So guess who has been binding them although I did have a couple of members come by and take some home. At this time I have 40 finished quilts here and 6 others who are with volunteers. There should be close to 50 when we are done. I told the Director of VJ that I would have them all collected by the beginning of June and we will make arrangements for delivery at that time. I will be using the "show and tell" website to share the finished work.

I know that some of you have finished bears and quilts at your house and Tom and I will arrange a collection time either by dropping them off to us or coming to you or planning an exchange spot that is convenient for you and us. We will continue to quilt for you if you have tops for either organizations. However, since June is our delivery date for VJ quilts and bears and you want to start a new quilt, I would encourage Hospice quilts. The size for these are approximately 38 inches to less that 60 inches.

I want to thank everyone for their contributions and wish I could name everyone by name but you would be reading forever. Whether you gave material for the projects or worked on the projects everyone should feel pride in being a part of this organization. Stay safe. "Until we meet again." (Who said that? Was that Gene Autry? No matter. It just dates me.) Connie Richardson.




