Last Meeting Minutes

Monday, October 10, 2022

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President, Jackie Sabo at 6:31pm.

WELCOME VISITORS Welcome Committee (Valerie McGarity): There were no visitors this month

OFFICER AND COMMITTEE REPORTS:

President, Jackie Sabo handed the meeting over to our **Location committee** to give a report on their visits to Calvary Lutheran, Concord Senior Center, Harrisburg Presbyterian and First Wesleyan. Julie Love spoke about our **2022 Quilt Show**. We needed more members to enter quilts, but Stephanie worked with what she received and recruited a 'featured quilter'. Our own Sylvia Stancil will be featured and will fill 8 panels with her quilts. A mover was hired to bring everything needed from our storage unit. Poles and drapes will be hung first to divide the room into vendor space and to hang quilts. Julie was asked to repeat our list of vendors: Sew Fabulous from Winston-Salem, JS Linens, My Scrappy Quilter, MLC Findings, K&J Sewing, Carolina Quilt Studio, Concord Sew and Quilt, Sew Perfect Tables, Lynne's Outlet and HHM (member booth).

She reminded members we need everyone to help to set-up on Thursday, Oct 13, beginning at 9am. Vendors will also be arriving on Thursday to set up. Anyone working the morning shifts on Friday and Saturday are asked to arrive by 8:30am

White Elephant items can be delivered between 9am and noon. Anyone with items to donate will need to bring them already labeled on set up day. Only cotton fabric and quilting items will be accepted. Label the cotton fabric measurements in ¼ yard increments only. Pricing is established at the show. Anyone that helps set up the White Elephant will get the first opportunity to purchase items.

Silent Auction, Terry Patterson and Jo Ann Hahn are ready for the show.

Raffle Baskets, Carol Harris, has 27 raffle baskets ready for the show.

Connie Richardson shared for **Community Outreach**. She thanked new member Katharyn Robertson for already turning in her charity quilt and her quilt raffle tickets. There will not be a charity sew this month but it will resume in November.

Carol Harris spoke for the **Holiday Party Committee**. The committee will provide snacks for the party. There will not be a meal. She requested 10 volunteers to be Table Captions and be responsible for decorating the tables. Prizes will be awarded for the best decorations which will be voted on by the attendees. Spools wreath



First, I want to thank all of you who made contributions to the White Elephant during the Quilt Show. I know you had to make an extra effort in marking your contributions, but it really paid off in the profit we made at the show. The Outreach program will benefit from this as well as other programs for the Quilt Guild. I also collected some leftover material which will come in handy in our workshops at the Fire Station.

The next Fire Station event is **Friday, November 11th** from 9 until 3. I will bring some of the materials to be cut into five" squares and 2 and 1/2" strips. Ideas for the use of these measurements will be shared at the workshop and at the November meeting. Again, this is a charity workshop, so you can work on any charity project, sew some of the blocks that will be shown, or just cut material into these squares or strips. I hope to see you on the 11th. I will be displaying all of the finished quilts, approximately 60 of them to be sent to the various organizations we decided to sponsor in 2022 at the November Quilt meeting. I will bring those that need binding also. I hope to see you at the workshop on the 11th and the Quilt Meeting on the 14th. With 8 "I Spy Quilts" and 6 quilts ready to be bound added to the 127 quilts already delivered, we have over 200 charity quilts given in 2022, and that isn't even counting the quilts that will be turned in in November. What a great accomplishment. Thanks to all the members who supported this "giving back." If you have ideas for sharing in 2023, please let me know so I can organize the list for voting.




