My mother was a very good seamstress and started teaching me to sew when I was about eight years old. She made all of my clothes. She also crocheted.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process?

I really don't have a favorite. I enjoy the entire process.

What is your least favorite part?

My least favorite is having to use my seam ripper.

What is your favorite technique?

My favorite technique is piecing and watching the pieces become blocks.

I once took a bobsled ride on the Olympic Bobsled run in Lake Placid, NY. It was both exhilarating and terrifying.

Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

I have lots of interests, but especially enjoy walking, yoga, and reading.

Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.

I am a former educator in Cabarrus County. I retired in 2013. Most of you know, we built our forever home and moved in April. I am still getting my quilting studio set up.

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild?

I have been a member since 2014. I knew Terry Patterson from work and she invited me.

Why did you join the CQG?

I was looking for a new hobby, and my mother had quilted. I had sewn clothes since I was a child. I put all that away when I was in my thirties - with children, step children and a job, there was little time for sewing. Since I love to sew, I thought this would be a great choice.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting? Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

I have been quilting for the past 6 years. I was determined to learn, so I bought an inexpensive machine from Walmart and bought a class from Craftsy. When I finished my first project, a 9 patched mug rug, I was off and running. My mother had quilted some in the late 90s, and I was interested in a craft that produced things you could use. My mother was very artistic. She painted, quilted, and sewed. She took lessons until she was in her late 70s. She was always interested in learning new techniques.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process?

My favorite part of the process is piecing. Although, it depends on what I am piecing.

What is your least favorite part?

Binding. I am still working on that part of the project.

What is your favorite technique?

Right now, I am learning how to do Edge to Edge Quilting. I just finished one quilt and am looking forward to using it on another. Usually, my favorite technique is what I am trying to do now. I just finished a top which I published on the website. So it looks like learning free motion quilting is going to be next.

What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know?

I have one grandson and three granddaughters. I have been helping them with their virtual lessons 1-2 days per week. We just build our forever home, and it is like starting over. We are on 10 acres and have just begun to make it our own.

Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

I have several other interests that keep me busy. I love to read and belong to a book club that meets monthly. I also love to cook. My husband and I enjoy being in the kitchen together. My preference is Italian cooking and his is good old Southern cooking. Lastly I love to garden. Vegetables and flowers are my favorites.

OCTOBER MEET AND GREET "TAG SALE" EVENT

There was a good response from the survey to encourage us to move forward with the outdoor (White Elephant) tag sale on the 17th of October (rain date the 24th) in the church parking lot from 10:00 until 2:00. We envision a causal social distancing with masks gathering among friends. There was expressed concern over our current Covid-19 condition, and we do take that very seriously. The event will be called off if safety continues to be a concern. In the meantime, we want to be optimistic and plan the event in moving forward. There are three main goals for this event:

- 1. safety
- 2. a fun opportunity to get together to see our quilting friends
- 3. a chance to rid ourselves of unwanted materials that might be useful to others or shop for new ideas
- 4. a chance to make some money for ourselves, the guild or both.

Any money you collect from your sales is up to you where it goes. We want this to be fun event.

Even though the survey outlined what needed to be done, we feel it necessary to reiterate and add a couple of points:

 You are responsible for preparation, set up (table and chairs) sales and materials not sold. 2. You are responsible for taking in money and providing change. (There will be no central cashier.)

Added notes:

- 1. Scraps should be bagged. This will probably sell better if they are bagged by color, theme or any creative ideas you might have.
- 2. We have some volunteers who are willing to help and give breaks so that people who set up can have breaks to allow time to shop and have fun beyond your own table.
- 3. Since keeping safe is a primary goal, masks and your own sanitizers will be needed.
- 4. If you don't want to set up your table by yourself, think about joining a friend.
- 5. If you already said you will set up a table on the survey, you will be contacted to confirm.
- 6. You may ask friends from other guilds to come and shop, but there will be no room for them to sell their goods.

If you would still like to do your own table and are not on the list or want to volunteer to help, call or email Connie or Marguerite so we can plan space. Any questions, please feel free to contact us. We should know by the end of September if we can move forward with this event. We hope we can do this.


