### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK




Hello Quilty Friends,

# **Last Meeting Minutes**

Monday, September 12, 2022

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by President Jackie Sabo at 6:31.

**Welcome Visitors:** There were no visitors this month.

**Approval of June Minutes:** Jo Ann Hahn motioned to approve the August meeting minutes. Mary Jo Ward seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

**Program:** Our program was presented by Annette Ornelas of Southwind Designs. She shared her curved piecing methods with us and many of her quilts and patterns. The program was enjoyed by all. And more members signed up for the workshop after seeing her method.

**Business:** President Jackie Sabo led the membership in discussing alternatives for our meeting location.

- Calvary Lutheran Church off Branchview Road 950 Bradley Street in Concord. The cost is \$75. The inquiry was only about Second Monday evening. This location is central to all of Cabarrus County.
- Harrisburg Presbyterian Church on Highway 49 4815 State Hwy 49. Second Monday and Tuesday are available. Cost is \$5 an hour for cleaning. Kitchen is available
- Senior Center is free and is available the First Monday and Tuesday of the month. Set up and clean-up is provided. Ice is available but not a kitchen. Contact is Teresa, 704-920-3467.
- First Wesleyan Church in Kannapolis 301 Bethpage Rd. Available second Monday. Would need to share room on the second Tuesday. No set up or take down needed. Donation to church for use.

Many comments were offered on where and what type of location is wanted: central location, tables, no set up or take down by members. Carol Ecker made a motion to appoint a committee to visit the 3 new locations and come back with a recommendation. Sandra Allred amended the motion that no current board members be on the committee. Melba Mick seconded the motion. The motion passed with one opposing vote, preferring a board member be on the committee.

The committee is taking more feedback on what members would like to have in our meeting place. Committee members are Janneke Bahamon, Carol Harris, Colleen Sain, and Delores Swartz.

**Vice President**: JoAnn announced our September Birthdays and reminded birthday members to pick up a fat quarter. She held a drawing for a free workshop and Valerie McGarity won. The raffle winner this month was Phyllis Grass.

**Membership:** Ann Weaver announced we had 51 members present in person and 1 on our Zoom call. We had one new member join, Katharyn Robertson.

**2022 Raffle Quilt** – Ann announced the next opportunity to sell tickets is at the Oct 8 Fall Craft Festival at the Cabarrus Brewery. Enough members were interested in helping so Ann will contact the festival to see if we can get a spot.

**Treasurer:** Johanna Hysell reported an audit was completed and the next one is scheduled. She asked for question and there were none.

**Activities:** Shanna Rogers announced this is our last month of Round Robin bag exchange. In October we will receive our bags back and can prepare a quilt top for sharing in November.

**Programs:** Karen announced we are not having a program or workshop in October. Program time will be used to finalize any Quilt Show needs. November will be our Charity Quilts and Challenge Quilts Show and Tell and a wreath making workshop will be hosted by Karen and JoAnn on Tuesday at Rocky River Presbyterian church. December meeting is our holiday party and Tuesday will be a sit and sew.

Please thank Karen for all her effort to provide us with wonderful programs this year. Mary Jo Ward will be our Program chair next year and is in need of someone to co-chair with her.

**Community Outreach:** Members presented the most recent charity quilts to the membership.

**Quilt Show Oct. 14-15, 2022:** Julie Love reported on our upcoming quilt show. YLI canceled but another vendor contacted Julie so we will still have 10 vendors. Our new vendor is Sew Fabulous from Winston-Salem. Our other vendors are: JS Linens, My Scrappy Quilter, MLC Findings, K&J Sewing, Carolina Quilt Studio, Concord Sew and Quilt, Sew Perfect Tables, Lynne's Outlet and HHM (member booth).

Sign-ups for helping with the show were available. We need more help. We especially need husbands and sons to help with set up and take down of the piping and drapes on Thursday, Oct 13 and Saturday, Oct 15. Six to eight foot ladders are also needed those days.

- Thursday, Set-up: 8:30am 6:00pm or completed
- Friday, 8:30 6:00pm, Show open 9am 5pm.
- Saturday, 8:30am 6:00pm or until take-down is completed, Show open 9am 4pm.

**Quilt Registration:** Registration forms were accepted by Stephanie Newbrough during our meeting. She received 39 registrations and needs 40 more. If enough do not come in, she will accept more than 2 quilts from members. Mail in registrations to Stephanie. You can text or call to let her know you have a quilt to enter.

While Elephant booth - Anyone with items to donate will need to bring them already labeled on set up day – the Thursday (Oct 13) before the show. Only cotton fabric and quilting items will be accepted. Label the cotton fabric measurements in ¼ yard increments only. Pricing is established at the show.

**Silent Auction** is still accepting donations (Terry Patterson & Jo Ann Hahn). Holiday themed items are usually very popular.

**Show Raffle Baskets:** Carol Harris is still accepting donations for the raffle baskets.

**Facebook Advertising:** Terry Patterson will update our event on FB (Oct. 1) with a picture of the Kaffe Quilt that will be given away as a door prize. Please share this event on your Facebook page as advertising. Every person that purchases an entry ticket will be put in the drawing for the door prize.

Show and tell was not held.

### WHITE ELEPHANT:

Because this event is such a money maker for the guild, we hope you will support this event with your donations. Because of limited space, we will accept only quilting (cotton material), quilting books, magazines and tools. All materials should be measured and labeled by quarters(either by length or fat quarters), half yards, 3/4th yards or full yard(s). If it measures less than one of these, go down. For example, if it measures 1/3rd yards, mark it 1/4th. Bring the items in a storage box labeled with

your name. (these boxes will be returned to you.) Large clear plastic bags will also work. Scraps need to be separated from measured material and put in a clear plastic bag. We are asking that you bring your donations on Thursday, the day of the set up but not before 9:30 so as not to interfere with bringing in and organizing the hardware for the quilt displays. The materials should be brought to Marguerite and me for acceptance before entering the White Elephant room. Charlotte Doyle will be in charge of organizing the displays in the room. She will need lots of help in this area so if you haven't signed up yet, consider helping in this room both for Thursday and the days of the show. We appreciate both the donations and your help. Thank you. If you have any questions, you can contact Marguerite or Connie Richardson.


