Member Spotlight-Karen Bronkhorst



Tell us about yourself in 1-2 sentences.

I was born in Chicago, Illinois. I have lived in Pennsylvania, Alaska, Illinois, and Iowa before moving here about a year ago. I have 3 sons and 8 grandchildren. I taught school for over twenty years (kindergarten through junior-high). I moved here after my husband died to be closer to my son and family. It has been an "interesting" move!

How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the CQG?

I joined the guild shortly after I moved here about a year ago. I met a lady in a sewing shop here, and she told me about the Cabarrus Guild. Being an active member of the Eastern Iowa Heirloom Quilters (about 250 members) in Cedar, Rapids, I knew it would be a great place to make friends and improve my quilting.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting?

I have been quilting for over forty years. I began in fiber arts with knitting and crocheting, then added weaving and spinning, and now I mostly sew and quilt.

Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

My mom is an expert in quilting. My guild in Iowa had many fine quilters, and our guild was able to bring to Iowa some really great teachers.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process? What is your least favorite part? What is your favorite technique?

I enjoy all the quilting process. There is such a feeling of accomplishment when you see the finished product. I love all the planning and the quilting. I am sometimes bogged down with the sewing. (But that is a good time to catch up on those books on tape!) My mom says I am a log cabin junkie! But I think that is such a versatile pattern. I also enjoy stars and love to see them in my quilts.

I have lived in Iowa the longest, so that has effected many of the patterns that I sew. I haven't found many farm scenes patterns around here-no cows or pigs! I lived very close to an Amish-Mennonite community so the material choices and patterns there were different, too. I visited more quilt stores in Iowa (Just look at my stash!), but I am still looking here!

What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know? Do you have any other interests or hobbies in addition to quilting?

I enjoy reading (mysteries mostly) and am always ready for a new book I like to knit and have started some Christmas shawls. I am slowly finding my way around, so I get lost less. I haven't found many sheep, so I am not spinning or weaving as much as I was.

Member Spotlight-Marguerite Klaiber



How long have you been a member of the Cabarrus Quilt Guild? Why did you join the CQG?

I joined the guild in September 2000 which was just a few months after we moved here. I had belonged to a guild in Connecticut and was delighted to find some new quilting friends here.

How long have you been quilting? How did you start quilting?

In the early 80s, I took a few classes at a quilt shop in Simsbury, CT where I learned about cardboard templates, piecing, hand applique and hand quilting. Soon after that, life got busy with family, volunteer responsibilities, etc. and I didn't return to quilting until the "nest" was almost empty about 15 years later. I met a coworker who introduced me to her guild. I joined that guild to take a Hawaiian applique workshop from Faye Labanaris and stayed for the friendships.

Were there other crafty people in your family that inspired you?

My Nana sewed my mother's clothes when she was young and later clothes for my dolls. Also, my mother taught me to knit, but there were no quilters in my family that I know of. Besides quilting I also have done some needlepoint, cross stitch, crochet and sewed some clothing for myself & my 2 boys. I enjoy swimming and walking for exercise.

What is your favorite part of the quilting process?

My favorite part(s) of quilting are the beginning & the end. That is choosing fabric, planning the design and hand sewing the binding on (relaxing).

What is your least favorite part?

Least favorite – machine quilting on my home machine (very tense)

What is your favorite technique?

You may have guessed by now that my favorite techniques all involve hand work -- piecing or applique.

What's something about you (a fun fact) that not many people know?

Little known fact: I was born and raised in New York City.

The September Meet and Greet is September 14th. The guild will have a "White Elephant" sewing related book swap! Bring one of your old books, or pattern booklets, that you are ready to donate....wrapped in no cost newspaper, brown paper, Sunday comics, etc with a note taped on the outside about what you liked/learned from your book (without revealing the title.) The rest of the game rules will be provided by Pat Hawkins at the meeting. It will conclude with a drawing for a new book!

OCTOBER MEET AND GREET "TAG SALE" EVENT

There was a good response from the survey to encourage us to move forward with the outdoor (White Elephant) tag sale on the 17th of October (rain date the 24th) in the church parking lot from 10:00 until 2:00. We envision a causal social distancing with masks gathering among friends. There was expressed concern over our current Covid-19 condition, and we do take that very seriously. The event will be called off if safety continues to be a concern. In the meantime, we want to be optimistic and plan the event in moving forward. There are three main goals for this event:

- 1. safety
- 2. a fun opportunity to get together to see our quilting friends
- 3. a chance to rid ourselves of unwanted materials that might be useful to others or shop for new ideas
- 4. a chance to make some money for ourselves, the guild or both.

Any money you collect from your sales is up to you where it goes. We want this to be fun event.

Even though the survey outlined what needed to be done, we feel it necessary to reiterate and add a couple of points:

- 1. You are responsible for preparation, set up (table and chairs) sales and materials not sold.
- 2. You are responsible for taking in money and providing change. (There will be no central cashier.)

Added notes:

- 1. Scraps should be bagged. This will probably sell better if they are bagged by color, theme or any creative ideas you might have.
- 2. We have some volunteers who are willing to help and give breaks so that people who set up can have breaks to allow time to shop and have fun beyond your own table.
- 3. Since keeping safe is a primary goal, masks and your own sanitizers will be needed.
- 4. If you don't want to set up your table by yourself, think about joining a friend.
- 5. If you already said you will set up a table on the survey, you will be contacted to confirm.
- 6. You may ask friends from other guilds to come and shop, but there will be no room for them to sell their goods.

If you would still like to do your own table and are not on the list or want to volunteer to help, call or email Connie or Marguerite so we can plan space.

Any questions, please feel free to contact us. We should know by the end of September if we can move forward with this event. We hope we can do this.


