Monday, February 13th, 2023

No further discussion was held on our donation to CVAN. As Collen reviewed in the bylaws, A portion of our profit for the raffle will go to CVAN. That will be determined each year and does not need to be a line item in our budget. Delores Swartz motioned we approve our 2023 budget, Johanna seconded it. 2023Raffle Quilt (Terry Patterson & Sharon Smith)

- Terry reported \$428 was sold at the Sanford Quilt Show. We have sold a total of \$580 including member ticket sales.
- Our next opportunity is March 4 at the Charlotte quilt show and signups are available.
- The Mancuso Greenville show is giving us the opportunity to sell raffle tickets at their show. They require 24 hours of white glove volunteer service over the 3 day show (April 20-22), 105 Thursday and Friday, 10-4 Saturday All volunteers must pay either the pre-registration fee or the general admission, so that they have proper identification to enter the show area, and we ask that all volunteers <u>supply their own white gloves</u>. If we have enough interest in volunteering, the guild will pay for a hotel room for 3 to stay overnight. If you want double occupancy, the guild will pay half the hotel fee. Members will still need to pay the \$15 admission fee.

Sylvia Stancil shared the Mt. Pleasant Museum will host a quilt show this summer. This is a non-judged show. They are surveying for possible interest. New and antique quilts will be shown, Exhibitors will be welcome to sell their quilts as well. Please email her if you are interested.

Members shared recent quilt finishes during show and tell. The meeting was adjourned at 9:05pm.

Square in a Square Class (SNS)

Join us March 14, 2023 for class to learn how to use the Square in a Square ruler designed by Jodi Barrows. Learn to make star points without having to cut and sew triangles. Just start with a square and sew strips on all 4 sides then trim with your ruler. It's like MAGIC!!

Supplies needed:

- Square in a Square ruler available here: <u>https://www.sewfabulousquilts.com/collections/notions-gifts/products/square-in-a-square-ruler-quick-easy-quilts-book-combo</u>
- Rotary cutter & mat
- Thread to coordinate with your fabrics
- Sewing machine
- Basic sewing supplies
- Optional Ruler to measure is 1/8" increments. Can use anything up to 12"

Fabrics – I'll be using patriotic colors during class, but you can choose from your stash. I will also have precut kits available to purchase at class time.

Please have fabrics cut and ready to sew prior to class time

White Fabric (or foundation color)

5-3" squares 2-3 3/8" Squares 8-4" x 2 ¹/4" Rectangles 1 strip 2" wide at least 20" long



Red Fabric (Star centers):

4 - 4" square

Blue Fabric (Star Points): (If you want a scrappy look, here's a good place to choose several blue fabrics) 2" wide strips 4 pieces width of fabric OR 8 pieces ½ width of fabric

Coordinating Red Fabric (cornerstones)

 $4 - 2 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares

The SNS technique is great for quilt design. The SNS Technique (Volume 1) and SNS Diamond Technique (Volume 2) have 39 options to create precise star points, adapt patterns, option sizes and so much more! One ruler, 40 options, unlimited combination possibilities.

MARCH PROGRAM USING THE SQUARE IN A SQUARE TECHNIQUE

Join us at our next guild meeting to meet Gloria Stickney from Sew Fabulous, Inc. in Winston-Salem, NC as she describes the secrets of creating precise triangle star points with the Square in a Square system designed by Jodi Barrows. Use the Square in a Square system to create borders to spice up your quilts and as she also looks at various ways to bind or finish your quilts.

Let's dive into thinking outside the box to create unique borders and bindings. The SNS system removes the challenges of cutting triangles and reduces the "human element" to create precise points with exact measurements.





There are 40 "Options" with the Square in a Square ruler and the combination of options is unlimited. Create unique borders for your quilts with the Square in Square technique. Gloria loves to design quilts! And this system makes it so EASY because the math is already done, and she can create blocks in ANY size with the charts of this system!

Gloria did not cut any triangles to make these blocks, just sew strips to squares. You might say, "How did you do that?" Join us March 13, 2023 to see some of the beautiful quilts created with this technique. Then plan to join the in person class on March 14, 2023 to create the Prairie Star block using the Square in a Square ruler designed by Jodi Barrows.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

It was great getting back with friends. The Fire Station charity workshop was very productive. We had 10 participants and were able to complete close to 50 bear kits. **The next workshop at the fire station is March 10th, the Friday before the March general meeting.** We still need more kits made, but we also need to start making the bears. If you would like to learn to make the bears or do a refresher course, I will be teaching this step by step. There will be other experienced people who will help in this process. If you just want to sew part of a bear such as arms and legs, this also will be helpful. If you can not attend, there are kits that can be done at home. Mary Shea was able to get the small black and white check material, enough to do the rest of the arms and legs which I am cutting now. I will bring these to the workshop and the next meeting. They can be picked up at my house if you want to use your own material or you can pick up kits. Even though Victory Junction was not voted on to do quilts, the bear project has been ongoing for the past 10 years making at least 100 bears a year.

The quilt projects for this year are to go to CVAN, Hospice and Jeff Gordan's Children's Hospital. Remember to turn in your charity quilt to Carol Harris to get credit and should be shared during Show and Tell for that meeting. Tom will continue to quilt any tops beyond your required completed quilt. As a side project, Tom and I are collecting place mats for Meals on Wheels clients, and we will see that these are delivered to various routes throughout the year. There are over 350 clients but most routes have around 12 to 20 clients so they can be done a route at a time. They do not need to be of a specific theme. This is a good way to use scraps and practice new ideas. A good size is 12 by 18 inches, but they can be any size or shape that can be used as a place mat. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me.




